

Family Diaspora flocks to Galway again for twelfth annual Mannion Clan Gathering

LARGE numbers from among the global Mannion diaspora from the US, Canada, Australia, Latvia and England - will join their namesakes from closer to home in Ireland this month for the Clan Gathering weekend.

It's the fifth annual Mannion Clan Gathering, focusing on the exploration of the origin, history and heritage of the ancient Ó Maíneadh or Mannion Clan of East Galway.

All are welcome - Mannion or not - to this special Heritage Week event on Saturday week, August 16, and is being arranged to offer the general public an opportunity to explore the decade-old Mannion Clan Historical Trail.

It will also highlight the work that is currently being undertaken as part of an initiative to develop a bilingual StoryMap dealing with the history of the Ó Maíneadh in medieval and early modern times.

The project is being funded by a grant from The Heritage Council under the Community Heritage Grant Scheme 2025 of the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage.

This digital heritage initiative involves the production of bilingual videos and podcasts relating to the historical, archaeological and cultural heritage of the Mannion Clan, to be added to Phase 1 of the StoryMap project being in 2024, which can be viewed via: <https://storymap.arcgis.com/>. /20240803/264046e0f08000...

This coincides with the second day of the three-day 2025 Mannion Clan Gathering on the weekend after next - Friday to

Sunday, August 15 to 17 - with a guided tour of the Mannion Clan Historical Trail, beginning in the car park of Frank Mannion's Lounge Bar, Abbeyknockmoy at 10.30am.

Elleragh, Clontarf and Mervagh castle sites will be visited during the tour, as will Ramon's cemetery situated in Mullaghmore West in the parish of Moylagh.

It was at this ancient assembly site that a five-year agreement was drafted by a Mac Egan lawyer for two leading branches of the Mannion Clan in May 1564.

Ballymansion, a sub-townland that formed a central part of the Ó Maíneadh lineage led down, will then be visited. After a break for refresh-

ments in nearby Mervagh, the tour group will head for Kilkenny Abbey, where the last recorded Chief of the Name of the Mannion Clan - John son of Malachy - was buried in a tomb dated 1648, with two of his kinsmen from their traditional stronghold of Mionbach Uí Mháinín, now Mervagh village.

The final stop on the tour will be at the site of the birth of Finian in the northwest of Loughrea, where in AD 1115 the reigning Ó Maíneadh king of Ioghan was slain in a violent confrontation between the forces of the O'Connors of Connacht and the O'Kellys of Hy Mayo. The tour group will then return to Abbeyknockmoy, arriving back about 5.30pm.

The second event of the day will take place in Thompson's Lounge Bar, Mervagh from 8pm to 10pm, and will feature the introduction and screening of Phase 2 of the StoryMap titled 'The Mannion Clan Historical Trail' / 'Cúrsaí I stairiúil Ghine D'Éil Máineadh'.

This will be followed by a number of illustrated presentations outlining the historical and various branches of the Mannion Clan in East and West Galway, utilizing a broad spectrum of DNA test results.

This twelfth Annual International Gathering of the Mannion Clan will kick off on the Friday evening, August 15, at 7pm in Thompson's Pub, with an Irish music session by popular trad group Bhanu, featuring Irish

sons Eada and Páir Mannion, and Brian Rogan.

This will be followed by the official opening of the 2025 Mannion Clan Gathering by Galway County Heritage Officer, Marie Mannion, with local County Councillor, Michael Connelly, welcoming the attendees to their ancestral home-lands.

An illustrated talk on the history and heritage of the Mannion Clan will then be delivered by Clan Historian, Dr Joe Mannion.

The evening will conclude with a top-class demonstration of traditional Irish and sea-side dancing by champion dancer, Maudie Ni Chasáin.

On Sunday week, August 17, the Ó Maíneadh ancestral village

of Mervagh will play host to a variety of exciting events, including a Clan Mass celebrated by Fr Colm Mannion OP, a pipe-led International Clan parade, and a BBQ overlooking the Mannion chloíneáirí's castle site.

This will be followed by a Gaelic medieval art and armour demonstration by Dara Beilín of Cluainín re-enactment group, a traditional Irish music session featuring Fr Colum Mannion, Alan Mannion, and Eada Faly, and the 2025 Clan Gathering fireworks and closing ceremony.
