

What's Proposed?


- 1.1km new cycle facility along Coast
 Road between the Mini Roundabout at
 Tesco and the Train Station Access
 Junction linking cyclists and pedestrians
 safely between Oranmore and Train
 Station with 5mins cycling commute
- Construction of new pedestrian crossings and an upgrade of the existing pedestrian crossings along the scheme to make it easier and safer for pedestrians to cross the Coast Road and at the junctions
- Upgrade key junctions along the route
- Kick-start provision of Active Travel
 Network in Oranmore








PROPOSED SHARED PATH CROSS SECTION

Things to Know

- Proposed cycle facility will be located to the north of Coast Road along the built-up areas and development zoned lands
- The Coast Road (R338) will remain two-way traffic
- Land acquisition is not envisaged

Why is this change proposed?

There can be an uncertainty around any street changes, and it can be hard to imagine the future. Here are some reasons for this change

Local Benefits What's in it for our area?

- Similar schemes in Ireland have increased numbers of those cycling and walking and helped make area safer, more pleasant and more attractive
- New cycle track will enable direct connectivity between Oranmore and Train Station
- New pedestrian crossing points and upgrades of the main junctions along the route will improve safety for vulnerable users (pedestrians, wheeling and cycling) and will encourage more people to choose to cycle or walk for short trips for work or leisure.
- Safer facilities will encourage active travel by children and residents.
- Carriageway narrowing will calm the traffic without impacting traffic volumes.
