PROCEEDINGS of the BOARD OF GUARDIANS acting as the BURIAL BOARD.

Mr. J. Kirwan reported the Superintendent of the Galway Cemetery for not complying with the direction of the Board to leave open the doors of the Mortuary Chapels on fine days as a remedy for dampness caused by confined air. That as a member of the Cemetery Committee he called attention to the fact when at a funeral on the 22<sup>nd</sup> instant, and in reply the Superintendent made use of abusive language towards him.

The Superintendent who was in attendance when this report was made, denied having made use of abusive language on the occasion referred to, and explained that the doors of the Mortuary Chapels had been open that morning but were closed before the funeral entered the grounds.

The Chairman called attention to the fact that this is the second report of a similar nature brought against the Superintendent within a short period by members of the Cemetery Committee, and administered a reprimand to him.

PROCEEDINGS of the BOARD OF GUARDIANS as LOCAL AUTHORITY under the CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACTS, 1878 to 1890.

The Constabulary reported that on the 28<sup>th</sup> instant a stray dog supposed to be rabid ran through a big portion of Galway, and bit three children and four dogs. The animal was shot at Bowling Green. A report was at once made to the Veterinary Inspector for the Union who made a post-mortem examination and pronounced that the dog had suffered from Rabies of the worst type. Two of the dogs that were bitten by the rabid animal were at once destroyed, and the other two were tied up and likely shall be destroyed today.

*McLachlan, Medical Officer of the Workhouse reported that one of the children bitten by the rabid dog is at present in the Workhouse Hospital, and he strongly recommended sending him for special treatment in the Pasteur Institute at Paris.*

Resolved - That the three children bitten by the rabid dog be brought to Paris by Relieving Officer J. J. McNeill, as soon as possible.

That we alter the Regulations for Muzzling of Dogs made on the 4<sup>th</sup> of December, last, by striking out the words "when not being under the proper control of the owner or person in charge of same".

That the Police be asked to report in every case where a dog be found in a public place in any portion of the Union unmuzzled.
