Kirwan, Medical Officer of Health, Craunmore Dispensary District, advising the Guardians not to exempt Mary Healy's house at Craunmore from registration as a Common Lodging House as it is most frequented by travellers coming from populous centres, such as Kimerick, Dublin, Waterford, Meath, &c. That the Common Lodging Houses Act is mainly intended to give Sanitary Officers liberty to cope with the spread of infectious or contagious disease, and to give them power to measure rooms and prevent overcrowding, to see to cleanliness and the proper separation of sexes.

26th May '96. Report from the Constabulary at Craunmore on a case of supposed Canine Rabies in the district. The animal was slaughtered.

The County Inspector, R. B. Galway W.P. wrote stating that the Police at the several stations in the Union have been instructed to carefully carry out the orders of the Guardians relative to muzzling of dogs.

The Police at Galway, Craunmore, and Spiddal Stations furnished lists of persons whose dogs were found at large unmuzzled.
