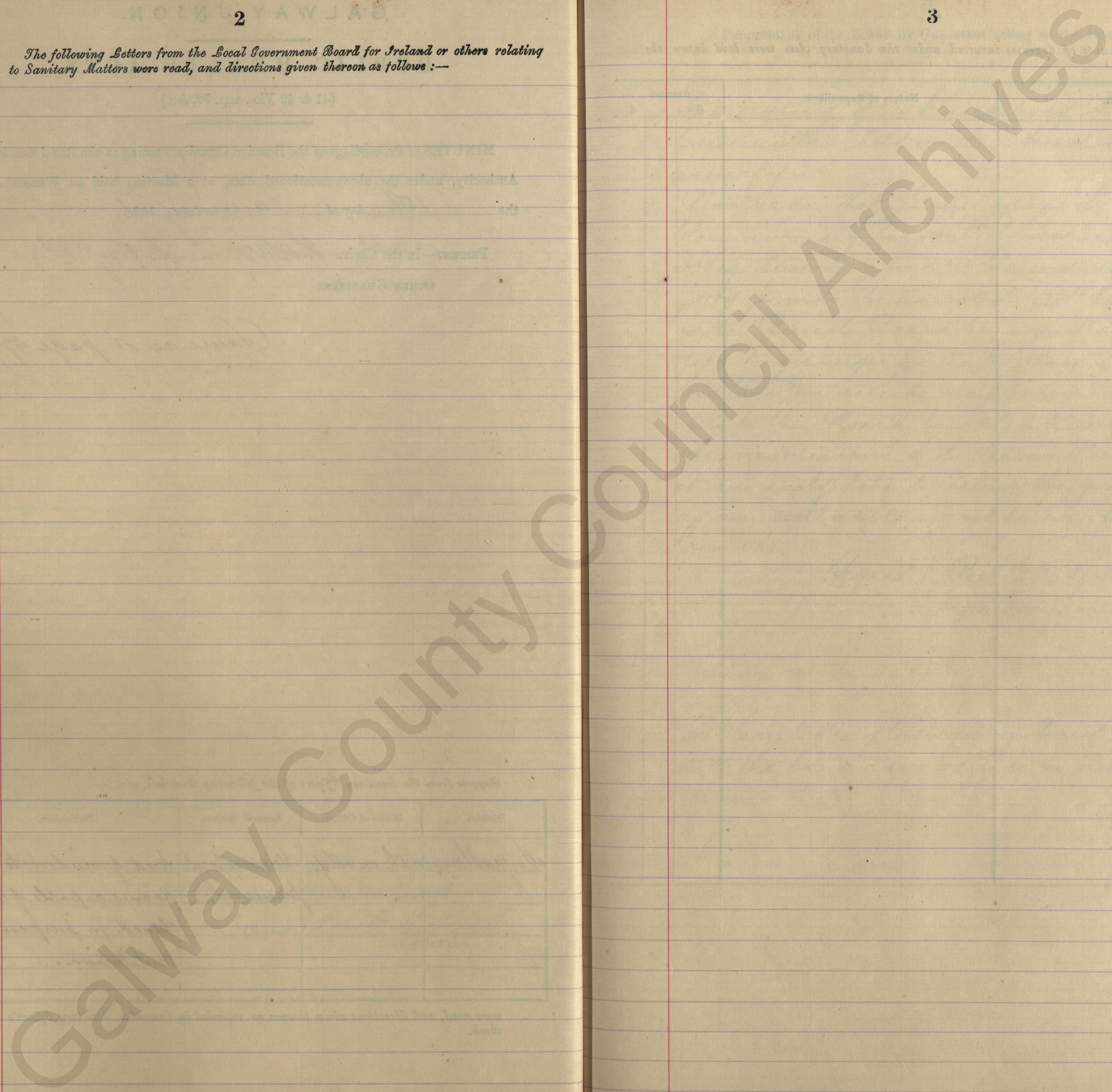

acting Chairman of Quarter Sessions to page 45 of Moores, i.e. Sec. 96. 1 + 2 Vic. cap. 56. Also to Mr. Wpe's work on stamps, to prove there was no necessity for a stamp on form of guarantee to make repayment for relief afforded in Workhouse by way of loan. The ruling being against him on both points, he applied to be allowed to amend Process so as to bring it within Sec. 4 of Poor Law Amendment Act, 1862, (making master liable for servant, &c.) Amendment having been allowed, it was held that the woman Loghlin could not be said to be a servant of Mr. Jendauts, and accordingly the case was dismissed. I advised an appeal, in which advice I was backed by Counsel's opinion - but your Board decided against appealing.

Calling attention to Officers' Bonds, which to be made perfect the Warrants of Attorney attached to same should be filed and registered. He fears if it ever turns up that it will be necessary to put them in suit, the Guardians will find it impossible to recover not having the Warrants of Attorney attached to same filed and registered.
