Report.

5th Feby. 96. In compliance with directions given me at meeting on the 22nd ultimo, I summoned the six persons whose dogs were found by Police straying on the public streets of Galway, not being under proper control, and not muzzled, in contravention of the Regulations made on the 4th December last, using my own name as Complainant as directed.

When the cases were called in Petty Sessions Court on the 27th ultimo, Messrs Daly & Murphy Solicitors, objected to the cases being heard unless the Local Authority were represented by a Solicitor. I referred the Magistrates to the Law Adviser's opinion given in Mooney's Compendium of Poor Laws, page 408. The cases were adjourned for a week to enable the Solicitors before-mentioned to obtain Counsel's opinion on the subject. On the 3rd instant, when the cases were again called, the Solicitors submitted the opinion of Mr. M. Healy, M.P. L. C. that in prosecutions under the Rabies (Ireland) Act, a Solicitor should be employed. Acting upon this opinion the Magistrates dismissed the cases. I was not allowed to go into evidence, and my application to have a case stated was not complied with.

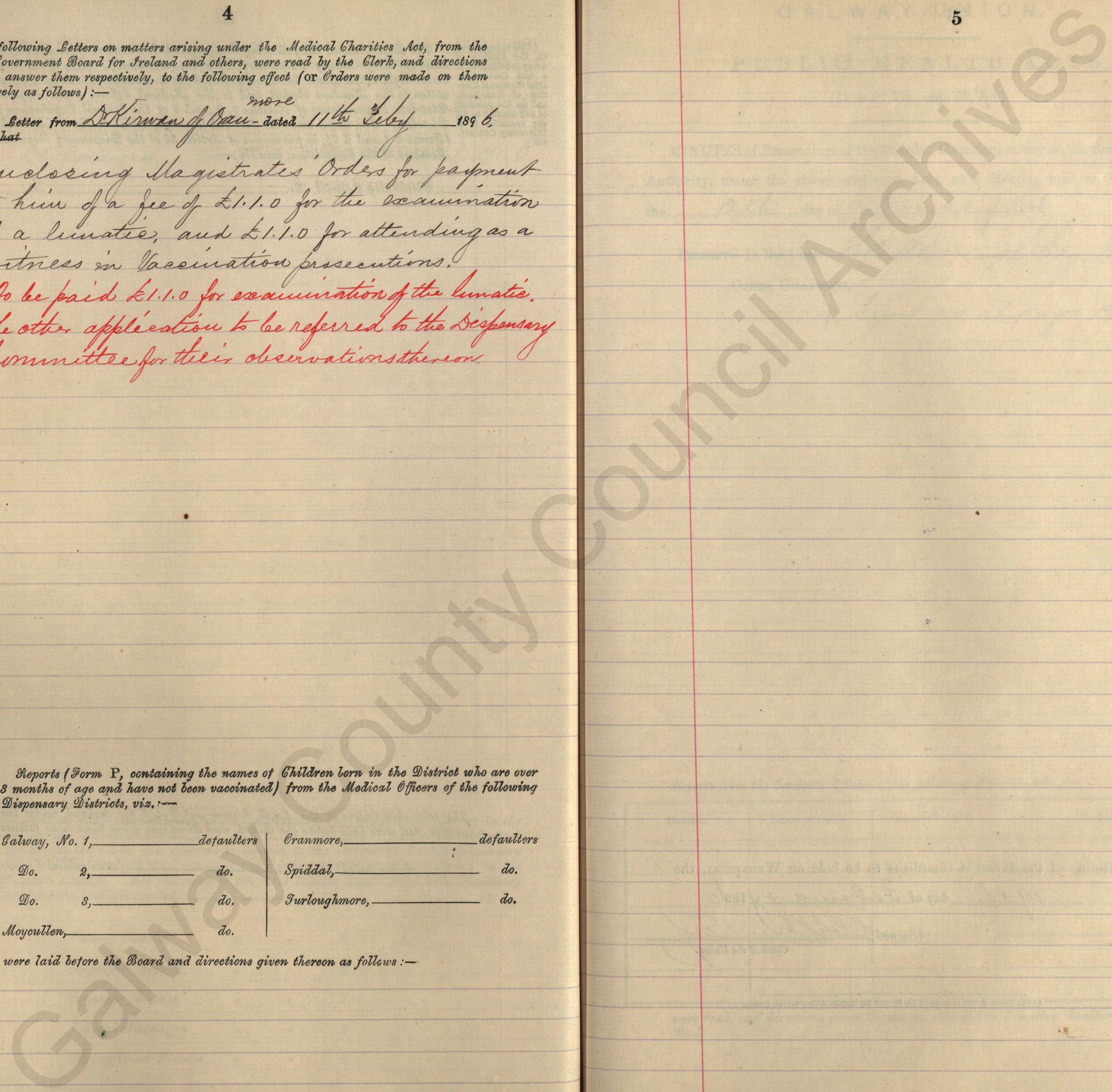
