Explanation of Misses in Workhouse Hospital.

" The circumstances under which the sisters were instrumental in sending Ellen Smith to Dublin are as follows.

The sisters were informed by this young woman that her brother was coachman to a doctor in Dublin; that she received letters from him occasionally, sometimes they contained remittances of small amounts; that her brother was anxious to get her to Dublin but was unable to remit a sum sufficient to pay the rail fare, but if she got there he would receive her into his house. Under these circumstances the sisters considered it an act of charity to advance the rail fare to Dublin in order that this young woman might be under the care of her brother, being of opinion she stood in need of some such guardian."

17<sup>th</sup> Sept. '96 From the Labra Deaf and Dumb Institution informing the Guardians that the Deaf Mute Thomas Small was not finally discharged from the Institution on the 17<sup>th</sup> of August last, but owing to delicacy of health and on the advice of the Doctor it was considered advisable to allow him remain at home for the winter, enclosing a letter from Rev. Dr. Craddock P.P. recommending that the boy be allowed another year's training in the Institution, Requesting to be informed whether the Guardians deem this arrangement satisfactory.

Order. — The Clerk to reply that the Guardians agree to this arrangement, but the boy must be received at a reduced rate as he will be over 15 years.

Mr Cameron furnished his report of analysis of ten samples of Teas forwarded to him. Mr Thomas Walsh's tea sample No 9 being reported best, he was declared contractor for the supply of tea to the Workhouse for ensuing year.
