26th Nov. } the half yearly report of their Inspector Major Rutledge Fair, consequent upon his inspection of the Workhouse on the 30th ultimo, from which it appears that the financial position of the Union is fairly satisfactory, but that there will probably be a deficit of £300 at the close of the financial year.

The Inspector again calls attention to the fact that the Infirmary is inadequate for the requirements of the Union, both as regards size and internal arrangement. The wards are much too small and badly ventilated, and most of them are neither plastered nor ceiled. The flooring in the upper
wards

wards is so defective that when they are being washed out the beds of the patients in the lower wards are often saturated with water.

Day-room accommodation for convalescent patients and additional space for the young children are much required.

The Inspector has on numerous occasions referred to the serious defects in the Infirmary, and the Board trust that the Guardians will take the necessary steps to provide sufficient and comfortable accommodation for the sick poor committed to their charge.

About 70 or 80 additional iron bedsteads with wire woven and fibre mattresses are needed. Those purchased by the Guardians in last Winter have tended much to the comfort of the patients. Window blinds or curtains should also be provided for the Infirmary, and a portable bath is much required in the Fever Hospital. Major Rutledge Fair observes that the allowance of meat (28 lbs.) supplied for soup for the healthy classes on Saturdays is insufficient and should be increased to 42 lbs.

Order. The allowance of meat for soup on Saturdays to be increased from 28 lbs. to 42 lbs. as suggested.

The Visiting Committee to be summoned to meet at the Workhouse at 12 o'clock on Tuesday next to consider the several other matters mentioned in the Inspector's report, and to report to the Guardians the result.

28th Nov 96, From the Commissioner of Valuation, acknowledging the receipt of lists of tenements in the Union requiring revision of valuation, transmitted by the Clerk of Union in pursuance of the provisions of the Act 17 Vic. Cap. 8. Sec. 4.

In pursuance of notice given for this date, Mr. P. J. Burke moved - that the Gate Porter of the Fever Hospital be allowed the same rations as the Gate Porter of the Workhouse, the increase being 1 lb. Butter, 14 lbs. Potatoes, and 14 Eggs weekly.
