The Police reported a case of supposed Swine-fever on the premises of Mary Concaunon of Carnarona, Spiddal.

14th July '96. Reply from Mr Philip McGovern of Glengriffin, Co. Cavan, to enquiry as to the number of persons bitten by animals supposed to be suffering from Rabies and who have been treated by him, and with what result.

That he is not able to state exactly the number of patients treated by him during the past 18 years, but that he has treated from 80 to 150 each year. Only 8 persons showed symptoms of the disease before commencing the cure, and they were cured and are still alive. Death after his treatment occurred in three cases only: two of them were children of two years of age each, who were unable to use his medicine; and the other, a young man 17 years of age who refused to take his medicine. That failure in his cure is impossible, if patients be sent to him in time. Enclosing printed copies of testimonials received from persons.

Minutes of Proceedings at a Special Meeting of the Oranmore Dispensary Committee held on the 28<sup>th</sup> July 1896.

Moved by Mr. Cullinan, seconded by Mr. Hartigan and

Resolved, that a cesspool be made 16 feet square on the clear, and 10 feet deep, the sides to be built of stones, the side next the river to be cemented, and the cesspool to be covered with iron bars and Malbay flags, and 2 feet of clay over all. The approach to it being an open drain, the sides of this drain to be built up with stones and covered over with flags, and 2 feet of clay; and the remainder of the drain towards the river, to be also closed up with clay. The Committee received the following proposal for this work, and they recommend its acceptance by the Board of Guardians,

"We hereby propose and agree to dig, line, and cover the approaching sewer to the Cesspool, which we hereby propose to make, the dimensions of which is to be 16 feet square, clear, length of approach to it about 26 yards, covered for the sum of £ 13 — I will give security for the work." Signed, John Cornaghten, Thomas Brennan, and John Hanonkin.

The Committee recommend that the principal sewer in Oranmore Village be extended to opposite Mr. Fitzmaurice's yard gate.

The Committee have to state that the wall around the Oranmore Wells is finished and may be paid for, and the work at the sewers is progressing and will be finished in a few days for which payment will be applied."
