It is especially desirable that the provisions of the Muzzling of Dogs (Ireland) Order of 1897 should be made known as widely as possible in the Union. Drawing attention to article 7 of the Order from which it will be seen that any muzzling regulations made by local authorities cease to apply so long as the Order in Council which extends to the whole of Ireland continues in force.
