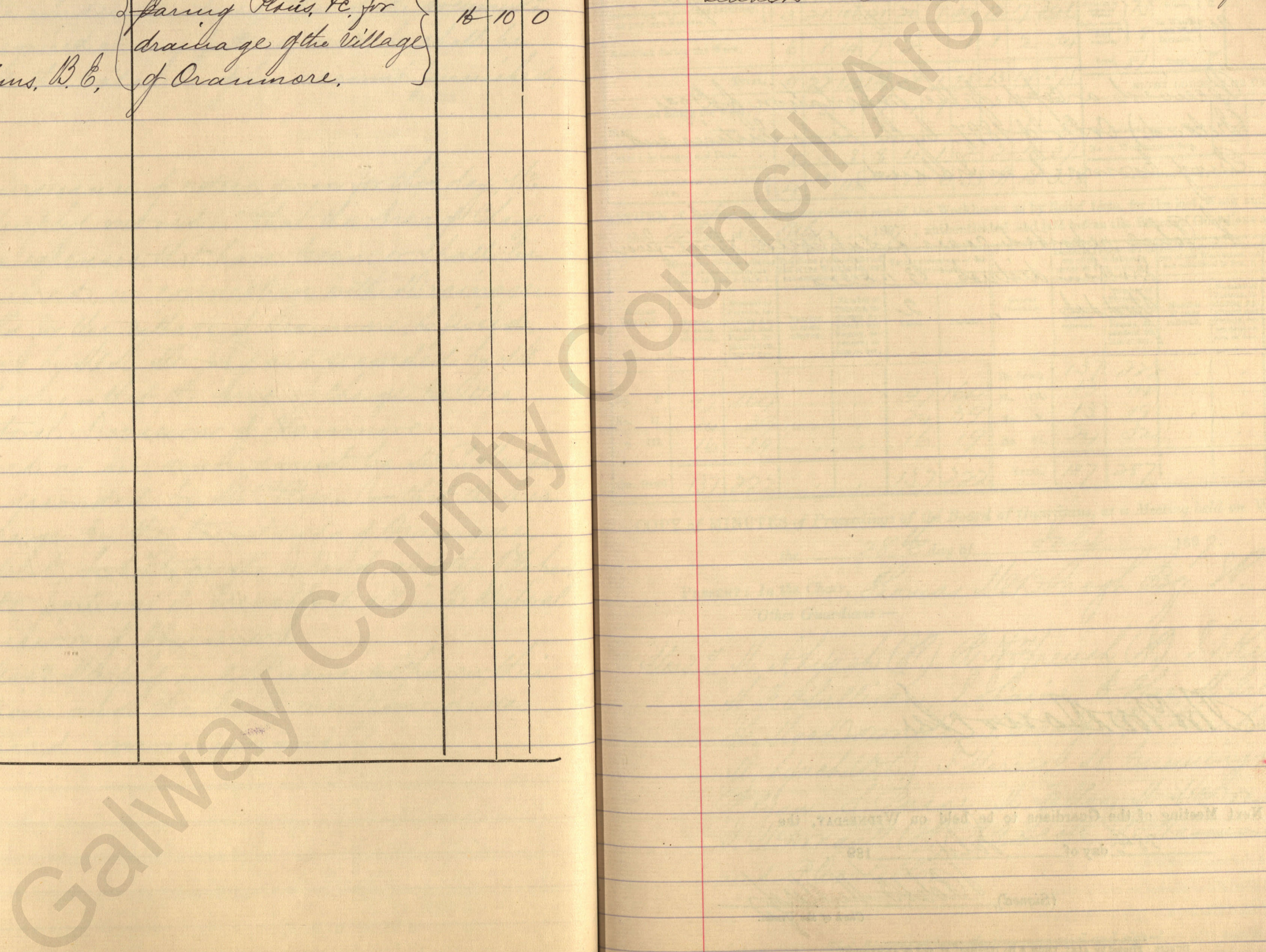

and the evidence of corroboration in Spelman's
case having turned out to be very weak, he
thought it prudent to drop it; but as Fleming's
case appeared a strong one, he took an appeal
from the decision of the Recorder, who dismissed
all three cases. As the Judge of Assize, who
reversed the decision of the Recorder, and
gave a Decree for amount sued for, with
costs.

That he is not able to state exactly the amount
of the costs incurred in the proceedings
against the putative fathers, as he may require
to take other steps to realize the amount of the
Decree against Fleming.
