The Guardians will bear in mind that in supplementing the Poor Law with the present special provision for the relief of distress it is not the intention of Government to subsidize a scheme for affording employment to all those who are willing to work, but on the contrary the work is only to be established as a labour test for those who, owing to the failure of the potato crop, are destitute and require relief, and who, unless relieved, would be obliged to enter the Workhouse.

The Rate Collector for Aran Islands district furnished a medical certificate that he has been ill from the 29<sup>th</sup> ult. to the 3<sup>rd</sup> instant and unable to leave his bedroom.

The following resolution proposed by Mr. J. G. MacDonnell and seconded by Mr. J. Morris was unanimously adopted. Resolved - That in our opinion the Catholics of Ireland should be relieved from the disabilities they have so long laboured under with regard to University Education; and we call upon the Government to pass a measure of relief for this urgent grievance in the coming session of Parliament and provide a liberal endowment for a Catholic University in Ireland.

The Clerk informed the Board that he had sent notice to each Guardian that at meeting today the Board would consider the reports of Committees deputed to recommend works as Relief Works for destitute persons in certain districts of the Union, and examine the lists of destitute persons to be employed on these works.

The reports received from the Committees of the districts of Aran Islands, Spiddal, and Moycullen were considered and adopted. The lists of persons to be employed

on the works were handed to the Relieving Officers of the districts named, with a view to striking out the names of persons not considered in need of relief.

The works to be undertaken in each district were agreed to. Hours of work from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. with an interval from 1 p.m. to 2 p.m. for dinner. The wages to be given to the workers, gangers, and Supervisors, were agreed to as recommended by each Committee, and the nominations of gangers and supervisors were accepted by the Guardians.

It was also arranged that payment for work in all cases be made in cash, and thus enable the workers to obtain food and fuel wherever the best value can be had for cash. Mr. John Lydon of Spiddal was appointed Paymaster over all Relief Works at a remuneration of £2.2.0 a week, to cover all expenses, except an allowance of 5/- a night when detained in discharge of his duties as such in the Aran Islands, together with steamer fare when proceeding to, and coming from the Islands.

Subject security to be given by the Paymaster. Mr. Perry, County Surveyor, explained that though employed by Government to supervise Relief Works generally, he wished the order of proceedings to be known to, and approved by the Guardians. In the first instance after the various schemes have been approved by the local Government Board, and the

Terms offered accepted by the Guardians, forms of consents for works have to be prepared and signed. He will order shovels, &c. from lists furnished by the Supervisors. The tools supplied will be given in charge to the Supervisors who will be responsible for their safe keeping. The Guardians approved of these arrangements.
