Stating that the Guardians' order and their contract were for delivery at Dublin carriage paid, and that at Dublin their risk and responsibility ended and that of the Guardians began. The N. G. W. Railway Co. were the Guardians' carriers, not theirs, and it is to them must be addressed any complaint or claim either for damage in transit from Dublin or loss of sale.

a family of seven or eight. This man never earns more than 9/- a week, and this earning is by no means constant, and even if it were it would be little enough to support his ~~large~~ family. Believing the old woman was much in need of relief, he tried to persuade the Relieving Officer to put her on his list but he declines to relieve her. Asking the Guardians to give the necessary order, and also he would like to have Guardians' opinion on the question as to whether the Relieving Officer is bound or not to give relief in a case where the Medical Officer is prepared to fill a certificate asserting that relief is necessary.
