

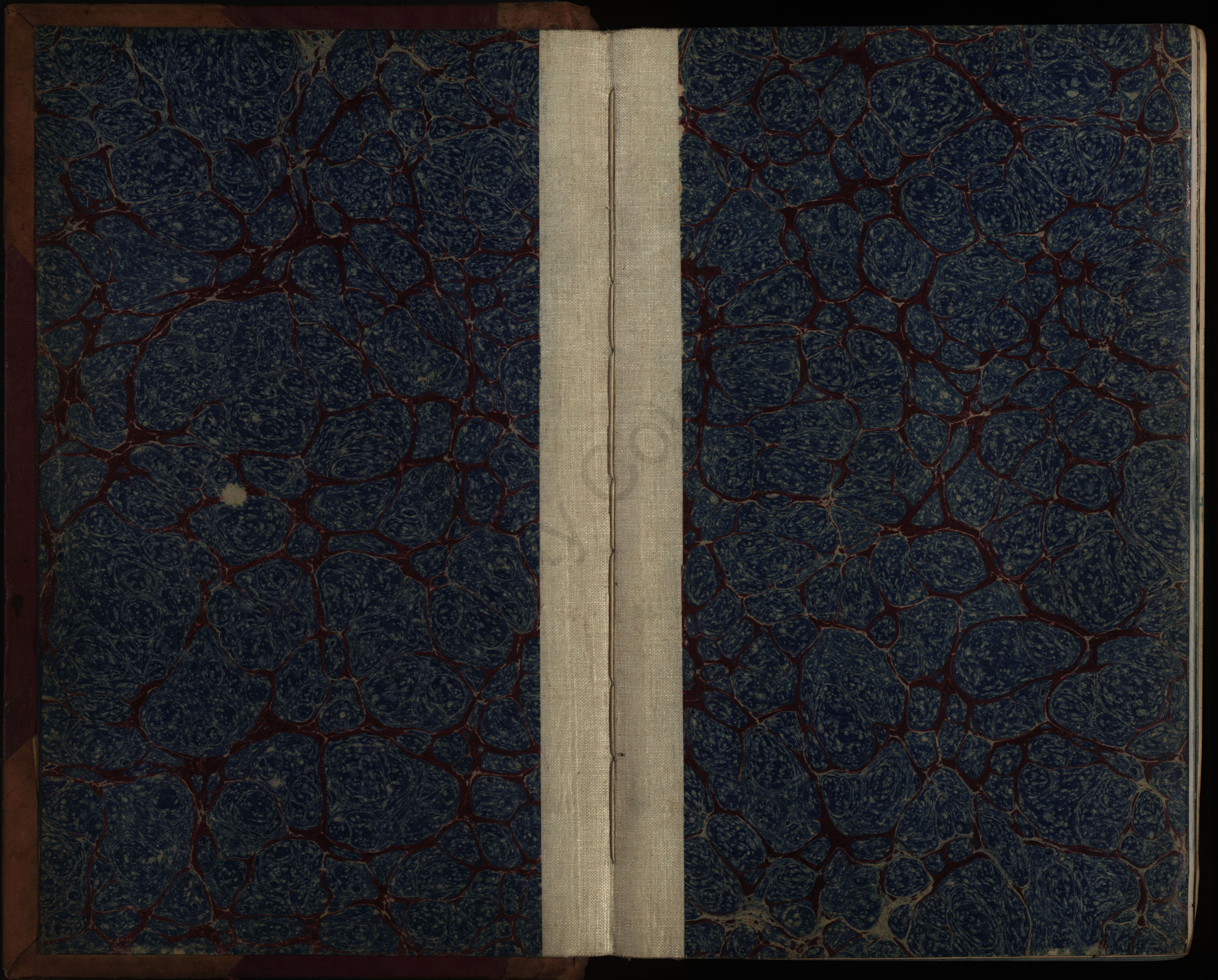

This being the first meeting of the new Board the Clerk submitted a Return of the Guardians elected on the 6<sup>th</sup> inst. under the provisions of the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898.

Carried unanimously.

On the motion of Mr. M. McNeill, seconded by Mr. P. J. Burke, it was unanimously Resolved — That the Guardians' meeting be held, as heretofore, at 12 o'clock, noon, each Wednesday.

It was moved by Mr. J. B. MacDonnell, seconded by Mr. B. J. Lee, and unanimously Resolved — That we the Guardians of the Galway Union elected under the Local Government Act, take this the first and earliest opportunity to voice the opinion of the ratepayers of the Union of our unalterable attachment to the principles of Home Rule, and to assert our firm conviction that there can be no true or lasting prosperity in Ireland until the Irish people have the making of their own laws through their elected representatives sitting in the old Parliament House in College Green.

auspices of a native Parliament our own dear old country would soon make rapid progress in prosperity and happiness, and that the Irish people instead of being badly housed and badly fed, would be able to live in comfort in the land of their birth.
