I said that the tincture of quinine was too low in spirit. It contained 69.93 per cent. of alcohol of 90 per cent. strength. This tincture is made by dissolving the quinine in tincture of orange. This tincture is prepared by digesting 5 oz. of orange peel in 20 oz. of spirit of 90 per cent. alcoholic strength. The matter ~~extracted~~ extracted from the orange peel could not displace 30 per cent. of the alcohol. The addition of 5 ozs even of water to 20 oz. of alcohol of 90 per cent. strength would not reduce its strength from 100 to 69.93

per cent. As regards the extract in the tincture of squills it is about 4 per cent. below the average quantity found in that tincture as the result of numerous analyses of known pure tincture made in this laboratory and in others."
