The following Letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland and others, were read by the Clerk, and directions given to answer them respectively, to the following effect (or Orders were made on them respectively as follows):

Read Letter from L.G. Board No 49/m/1900 dated 22nd March, stating that

in view of the recommendation of the Royal Commission on Vaccination, they have had for some time under consideration the question of the advisability of their supplying glycerinated calf lymph for use in public vaccinations instead of humanized lymph.

The Board are now in a position to state that they have made the necessary arrangements for the gratuitous distribution, through their Vaccine Department, of calf lymph to Workhouse and Dispensary Medical Officers from the 1st probe; and the Board have decided to discontinue altogether the issue of humanized lymph after that date.

24th Mar. 1900. From the Registrar General, stating that the fee of £2 2-0 claimed by Dr. Kierwan of Oranmore for attending the Lashagh Dispensary as Dr. Glynn's Substitute will be paid his Department.

23rd Nov. 1900. Sir C. A. Cameron, Analyst, reported on a sample of drug received from the Spiddal Dispensary as follows:—
