The Clerk explained that he summoned this Special Meeting by direction of Sir A. MacCullagh, L.C. Medical Inspector.

Sir A. MacCullagh explained his reason for desiring to consult with the Board of Guardians, the Port Sanitary Authority, that steps may be taken towards having a strict medical inspection made on board every vessel coming from Glasgow immediately she arrives on the roadstead, in order to prevent persons suffering from, or suspected to be suffering from, Bubonic Plague landing from such vessels, as Bubonic Plague at present exists in Glasgow.

He entered into a full explanation of the precautions already taken in other sea-ports in Ireland.

After some discussion the following resolutions were passed:

1. That Dr H. Hayden be appointed Medical Officer to the Port Sanitary Authority, and during the prevalence of Bubonic Plague in Glasgow, he will be required to make an inspection on board every vessel coming from that city, immediately on her arrival on the roadstead.

stead. That he be allowed a fee of £3.3.0 together with 7/6 for boathire for every such inspection.

2. That the Executive Sanitary Officer be informed of the probable and actual arrival of vessels from Glasgow by the Harbour Master; that he will at once furnish such information to the Medical Officer; that he shall consult with the Harbour Master and Superintendent of Customs as to all necessary arrangements,

3. That the following members of the Board be, and hereby are, appointed a sub-committee; and that they are authorized to arrange for the hiring of a house to be used as an observation, where suspected cases may be confined for a time while under observation; and to make other necessary arrangements; viz: Messrs J. McDonough, J. Morris, M. Fallon, C. J. Burke, J. Gealy, J. O'Donoghue, and Col. J. O'Hara, That such committee hold meetings when considered necessary. That a meeting be summoned for 11-30 am, on the 12th inst.
