The Guardians having called on the Clerk to produce the Minute of Mr. Bradshaw's appointment as Superintendent of the Disinfecting Chamber, he read as follows from the Minutes of 9th May last:

"That Mr. Bradshaw be appointed to superintend the working of the Disinfecting Chamber at a salary of £8 a year. One of the attendants at the Fever Hospital to be required to place the clothing, &c. to be fumigated and disinfected in the Chamber."

Payment refused as the Guardians consider the salary of £8 a year covers remuneration for all duties in connection with the Disinfecting Chamber.

The following Letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland and others, were read by the Clerk, and directions given to answer them respectively, to the following effect (or Orders were made on them respectively as follows:

Read Letter from Dr. M. J. Hyden dated 24th inst. stating that

accompanied by the Relieving Officer of the Aran Islands District he visited the South and Middle Islands on the 20th inst. On the South Island there was not a trace of either an infection or contagious disease. That he inspected several houses on this Island and found their sanitary state satisfactory. On the Middle Island he visited all the houses mentioned in a report to Sir A. Macbrunnagh and found that most of the persons mentioned therein were going about their ordinary occupations, and that the remainder were convalescent. That there is a marked improvement in Dr. Kean's condition and that he considers him out of danger.

That there are no fresh cases of contagious or infectious disease on either of the Islands, and he thinks the epidemic is practically at an end.

The Guardians expressed pleasure at receiving this very satisfactory report.

The Clerk informed the Guardians that in compliance with directions given him at last meeting he had arranged with Dr. Kinsella to act as temporary substitute for Dr. Kean, Medical Officer of the Galway No 3 (Aran Islands) Dispensary District, at a remuneration of £4-4-0 a week and to be allowed travelling expenses coming to and leaving the District.
