4th May, 1901. From Rev. M. Farragher, P. P. Aran Island, stating that he has seen by one of the Galway Papers that at a recent meeting of the Guardians it was stated that the Fever in Aran was practically over, that this statement was made when the late D. Keane was practically in the throes of death from Fever, contracted in the discharge of his duties, that he regrets there is reason to believe that this is not quite correct, as within the last few days there are at least 4 fresh cases of sickness in the Middle Island which he believes is still Fever, that for any steps that have been taken to prevent the spread of the sickness it may go on for many a day, only 3 days since he saw clothes being cleansed at the Well in Kilmurroy and some actually steeping there, that he was informed, and believes the information is correct, that the clothes worn by a fever patient were, after her recovery, washed at this well, that it is now a considerable time since he complained of want of sanitary supervision, and pointed out that an outbreak of Fever might occur at any time, that when D. Keane got sick the Islands were left for a whole week without a doctor, trusting that something may now be done to prevent the further spreading of this Fever.

That while in no sense surrendering even a particle of our claim in common with other local representative bodies to the right of controlling the force, which is denied to us by the said British Government, we insist that the Irish Constabulary, whose capability, character and independence will contrast favourably with any

British Police Force, so long as they remain under the control of the British Imperial Ensign, shall not be made the medium through which a slur may be cast on their countrymen, but shall be paid at least as well as any Police Force in the Kingdom. And we hope and expect that their claims will receive in the House of Commons the support of Irish Nationalist members of Parliament.

That copies of this Resolution be forwarded to Mr. J. Redmond, M.P., Col. Nolan, M.P., Hon. Mr. Morris, M.P., His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant, the Chief Secretary, the First Lord of the Treasury, and to the Galway Urban District Council, the Inspector General, R.I.C.
