The Reports of the Master and other Officers were read, and orders made thereon as follows:

I suspended the Steam Boiler Attendant from work on Friday last. He has been drinking for some time, and absented himself from the workhouse on the night of the 7th inst. On Friday he set about cleaning the boiler, and in the evening went to Mr. Binns office to say he had put it out of order, and to send up a man as we were not able to set it right. He even said he would blow every plate of it to pieces. His conduct in the meantime has been most unseemly, and his language unfit for reproduction.

Mr. Binns sent up one of the Lydon Bros. He spent several hours testing it and left it in thorough working order.

Mr. Binns Assistant and myself induced the Porter to work it temporarily, and I am glad to say it is being done satisfactorily.

A patient named John Bullinan was admitted to Hospital on the 8th inst. suffering from injury. He died on the 9th inst. A Coroners inquest was held on the remains. Verdict - "Rupture of the intestines caused by violence inflicted by some person or persons unknown."
