The appointment was proposed by Mr. D. Donohoe, and seconded by Mr. M. McNeill. An amendment that no such appointment be made, was proposed by Mr. J. W. Spence, and seconded by Mr. M. Lynch.

On a division the amendment was lost, 5 Guardians having voted for, and 11 against it. The original motion was then declared carried.
