3rd July '02. From Mr. John Curneen, stating that at the Guardians' meeting on the 2nd inst. the Relieving Officer for the Galway District stated that he gave him (Curneen) an order for admission to the Workhouse for one night as a tramp; that he got a medical certificate from Dr. Waters for admission to Hospital. These statements are false inasmuch as he never applied to the Relieving Officer for an admission order, or to Dr. Waters for a medical certificate; that he was not a tramp, as he had come to Galway as an assistant at the Boys' Industrial School; that the Schoolmaster of the Galway Workhouse engaged him as an assistant and a helper in general in the Workhouse School at a salary of £4 a year. That he came direct from employment at the Industrial School to the Workhouse.

Furnishing

Furnishing a copy of a discharge from the Superior of the Industrial School, Galway which vindicates his character.

The Guardians having inquired into the particulars of this case have come to the conclusion that Mr. Toole, the Workhouse Schoolmaster, procured the admission of John Curmeen to the Workhouse as an Hospital patient in an irregular manner in order to obtain his services as an assistant in the Workhouse School, that the Relieving Officer for the Galway District, Mr. Sullivan, made an incorrect entry of the particulars of the case in his Application and Report Book.

Moved by Mr. J. Hydon, seconded by Mr. H. King and Resolved that the Schoolmaster and Relieving Officer be called before the Board and severely admonished, and as a punishment they be required, between them, to defray the cost of the maintenance in the Workhouse of John Curmeen from the 28th of February last to the 3rd inst.

The officers were called before the Board and admonished. They expressed their willingness to defray the maintenance charge as proposed by the Guardians.

I am not charged with anything definite
except that I failed to attend the Dispensary
on the 23rd June. That is a matter for the P. O.,
as I informed him on the previous day about
it. Dr. Lambert promised to attend but he
did not turn up."

14-7-'02. "I regret very much that my letter was not
before the Board on last Wednesday as I
posted it on the previous Tuesday. The
Secretary of the Post Office is making inquiries
about it. Let me state that Dr. Lambert did

not apply for two months leave of absence; that
he did not leave his district; that he attended
