are the true facts of the case, on the day in grestion, about 5 peu, I had occasion to send a boy named Mechael Long, a people of suice, on a message to Gradleys the tailor, who leves in Daugan, When he had got as far as the Horkhouse gate, William Fagan, who by the way was ejected from this school a few years ago for misbehaviour, refused to allow how out. I went myself and asked tagan to allow the messenger out, and he refused, stating that he was Master and Sarker of the Worthouse for the time being, and that he had full authority to do what he pleased. Then questly explained to him that I was responsible for the descipline of the house during the obsence of the Moster, and that the safestand the easiest course for him was to do what he was directly told. But he still persested on refusing to allow the boy ont. I then asked him to allow suyself out and he treated me in the same way, whereupon I removed him from the gate without assaulting him on any way; Immedeately he took apone of the paving clones which border on the flower beds and fling it at me, for which offence, as well as for abusive language I could have got him severely pinisked according to articles 38 and 39 of the Horkhouse Rules if I so desered, In the following day on fulfeliment of his promise that he would desgrace me before the public, he presented me with a Summions to attend the Petty Sessions bourtbut he did not appear, and of course the case was discussed, I beg to clate that I had no other releable messenger afthetime with the exception of an old sufirm sumate and Shad to sise my own bescretion. I would have gone suyself rather than

endure bublic humiliation from an simate of the Horkhouse, but for the fact that I was bound to remain in the house as all the other officials were out; The above statements can be verified on oath by several witnesses. In conclusion I respectfully ask your Board to protect one from the doubarrantable attacks of irresponsible paupers invested soith a little brief authority which has often leave reallessly abused.

The tooth instruments are in a bad condition, they do not appear to be Keptin a careful manner, The supply of medicines is not very good, there are so pills except a few colocynth, no quincine and the powders are badly Kept- in paper bags,

The Dispensary buildings might be Keptcleaner, the Maiting-room is very small and has no fireplace. The cost-bythe medieines for the past-year amounted to £19-8-11. I consider cost-very excessive: the only special item I can call attention to is bocaine of which a large grantily is ordered. The list of mistruments provided for Dispensary use is not submitted to the blesh of the Minon: A Hidwife is required; there is no woman with any Kubioledge of midwifery in the District, there were a comple of fairly good handy swomen but they have died; the Medical Officer has often to act-as muse as well as
