Suggesting that in addition to whatever time he may be allowed in the fore or afternoon two hours be set apart after 8 o'clock for each recreation each evening.

Order. The Medical Officers of the Workhouse to be requested to suggest a suitable time each day to be allowed the Porter for recreation.
