of the water supply will be duly notified to the Workhouse Master in future.

27<sup>th</sup> June '04. From the Clerk of Union, Newry, forwarding a copy of a resolution adopted by the Guardians of that Union as follows:—  
 "That in the opinion of this Board, the clause in  
 " the Irish Poor Law Relief Acts, which prohibits  
 " Boards of Guardians granting out-door  
 " Relief, other than Provisional Relief, to persons  
 " in the occupation of more than one-quarter  
 " of an acre of land, should be repealed or  
 " amended."  
 Adopted unanimously.

28<sup>th</sup> June '04. From Miss Sarah Galbraith, stating that she has been informed that a child named Kitty Charles from the Protestant Orphanage, who was sent to the Union Hospital suffering from measles, was admitted as a pauper, consequently not to be paid for. That as the Committee pay rates for the Orphanage they should not be called upon to pay for the girl's maintenance.

Order. To be informed that before issuing the order for the girl's admission to Hospital, the Relieving Officer notified the occupier of the Orphanage that a claim would be made for maintenance, &c. That inmates of the Industrial Schools in Falway, and of the Protestant Orphanage at Spiddal, are always paid for under similar circumstances.

1<sup>st</sup> July '04. From Mrs. Mary Joyce, Doughterard, applying that her grandson, James Lee, aged 14, an inmate of the Workhouse, be allowed to reside with her.

The boy's parents are dead.  
 Application granted. Allowed £1.5.0 for clothing.

4<sup>th</sup> July '04. From Mr. J. Sullivan, Meat Contractor, giving notice that Paying orders for value in meat supplied by him to the Workhouse, are only to be handed to him, or to Mr. Murphy, Solicitor, or to Mr. Murphy's Clerk.  
 Order. This request to be complied with.

6<sup>th</sup> July '04. From Joseph Bradley, Workhouse Tailor, applying for two days' wages stopped from him for absence from work owing to illness.  
 Order. To be paid wages for the two days.
