He trusts that in the coming election of Medical Officer for No 1 Dispensary District the Guardians will show their good sense of uprightness by refusing to vote for any member of the S. H. S. who sends in his name—men who have neither the honor nor the courage of gentlemen to keep their pledged words.

Relieving Officer O'Sullivan reported that Dr. Peart having declined to act as temporary Medical Officer of the Galway No 2 Dispensary District and the Workhouse at the remuneration of £4-4-0 a week fixed by the Guardians at last meeting, he approached Dr. J. McDonagh of Merchants Road who informed him that he would be unable to act, that

he (the Relieving Officer) then arranged with Mr Peart to act until the next meeting of the Guardians at a remuneration at the rate of £5-5-0 a week.

The Guardians, under the circumstances approved of the arrangement made by the Relieving Officer.
