The Milk Contractors are not supplying the required quantity. I had to purchase from others 131 gallons of milk last week, having to give substitutes besides, charging the contractors with the extra cost.

Workhouse Medical Officer.

The supply of milk is extremely short and the several departments of the house are suffering seriously.

Order the Milk Contractors and their sureties to be again cautioned.

Since the boiler formerly used for boiling the soiled clothes coming from the Hospital wards was removed no boiler had been put up to replace it. This is a very serious matter, as these clothes are full of foul discharges and infectious matter, and cannot be properly cleansed and disinfected without boiling.

4<sup>th</sup> March. } Referring to Minutes of 6<sup>th</sup> January last and stating that the Board have now sanctioned the payment of sums of £ 6-10-0 and of £ 2-5-0 to the Teacher of the Male School, and the Teacher of the Female School, in the Workhouse respectively; being the amounts which would have accrued to these Officers as special fees for the teaching of Irish if they had been Teachers in an ordinary National School.

12216/1904.  
7<sup>th</sup> March. } Acknowledging the receipt of replies to their enquiries respecting the temporary employment of M<sup>rs</sup> Mary J. Bowles as nurse in the Workhouse Fever Hospital, and stating that the Board have sanctioned the proposed payment of remuneration at the rate of £ 1-11-6 a week with rations in this case.

5<sup>th</sup> March '04 From Mess<sup>rs</sup> W. Hogg Esq. of Dublin, enclosing for the information of the Guardians' Solicitor, a copy of the Deed of Assignment - Richards to them - that Mr Richards furnishes the amount as £10-6-6, inquiring if this be so.

7<sup>th</sup> March '04 From the Guardians' Solicitor, acknowledging the receipt of a copy of what has been termed an Assignment which he finds is dated 20<sup>th</sup> ult. and considering that two days afterwards Mr Richards took protection of the Court, he is inclined to think that it could be construed as a document giving Mess<sup>rs</sup> Hogg preference over other creditors. He should not therefore advise the Guardians to pay any of this money at present. It would be well to <sup>write to</sup> Mess<sup>rs</sup> Hogg to inform them that the Guardians have been informed that Mr Richards' estate was in Bankruptcy since the 23<sup>rd</sup> ult. and to protest themselves the Guardians may deem it necessary to communicate with the Assignees in Bankruptcy before paying over the money or that some indemnity should be given the Board to protect them from any claim that might afterwards be made by the Assignees. When a reply has been received from Mess<sup>rs</sup> Hogg he will write to the Assignees to know how the matter stands.

7<sup>th</sup> March '04 From the Secretaries, Office of National Education, Dublin, acknowledging the receipt of a copy of a resolution of the Guardians on the 2<sup>nd</sup> inst.

the receipt of a copy of the resolution, and stating that it deals with certain repressive measures calculated to impair the efficient teaching of the national language of Ireland and which the Commissioners of National Education have recently enacted. Assuring the Guardians of his sympathy with their <sup>the purpose of</sup> patriotic resolution, the Irish Party strongly complained in the House of Commons of the new regulations, and the matter will not be allowed to drop.

Farrington of Cashla, stating that he will allow any boys the Guardians may apprentice out to him to go to Mass on every alternate Sunday and Holiday of Obligation, enclosing a letter he received from the Rev. Canon Cauton, P.P., stating that he is aware it would not be possible for two boys to go to Mass (the Chapel being 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> miles distant from Mr Farrington's) on every Sunday and Holiday.

The following Letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland, and others, were read by the Clerk, and directions given to answer them respectively to the following effect (or Orders made on them respectively, as follows):-

Read Letter from L.G.B. No. 13902/1904, dated 8<sup>th</sup> March, 1904, stating that

the Board have had before them the Clerk's letter of the 5<sup>th</sup> inst. in reference to the application of Dr. Thomas J. McDonagh to be declared duly elected as the Medical Officer of the Galway No. 1 Dispensary District, on the ground that at the election held on the 24<sup>th</sup> inst., he received a majority of the votes of the Guardians who were qualified to vote on the occasion.

It appears that the voting resulted in a tie, 31 votes being recorded in favour of Dr. McDonagh, and 31 in favour of Dr. Waters.

The Board have to call attention to section 30 of the Act-1 and 2 Vic., cap. 96 which is as follows:-

"Provided always, and be it enacted, that no defect in the qualification, election, or appointment of any person acting as a Guardian at a Board of Guardians shall vitiate or make void any proceedings of such Board in which he may have taken part.

Article VI. par. 6, of the Application of Enactments Order of the 22<sup>nd</sup> December, 1898, provides that

"the acts and proceedings of a person in possession of a corporate office in a Council or Board, and acting therein shall, notwithstanding his disqualification, be as valid and effectual as if he had been qualified."

In these circumstances the Board are of opinion there must be a new election, neither of the two candidates at the final poll being duly elected.
