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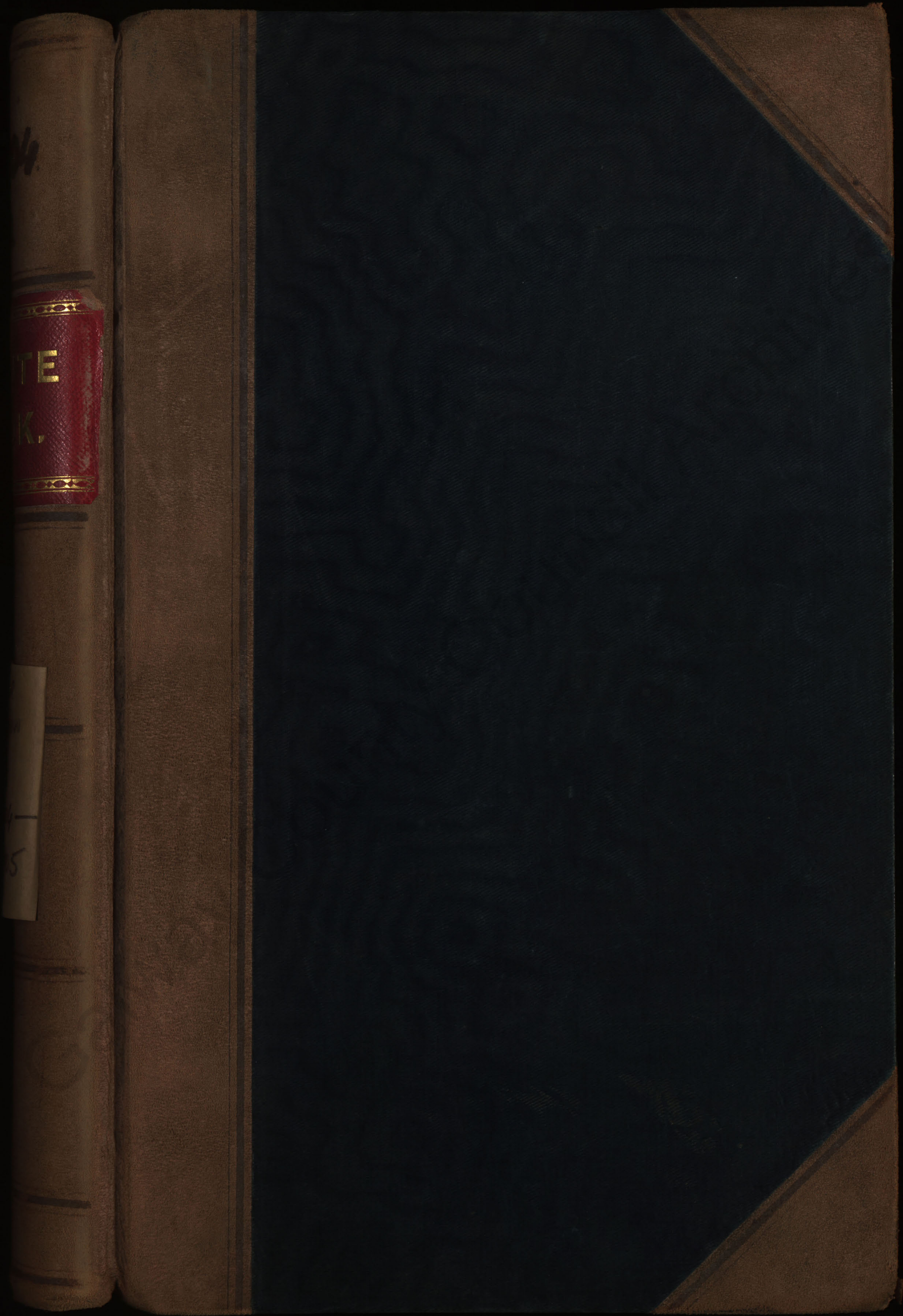

The adjournment of the Board meeting having been proposed, Major Rutledge Fair, L.C. Inspector, requested that before the adjournment an important letter from the Local Government Board should be read; this was agreed to and the following letter was read:—

26th July. } Forwarding a letter which has been received from Mr. Hensey, in which he ^{prefers} complains against certain officers of the Union relative to the treatment of his late wife whilst a patient in the Workhouse Hospital, and to the charge for her maintenance, &c.; and requesting that the Board may be furnished with written explanations from Relieving Officer Sullivan the Acting Master, and the Workhouse Night-

Nurse, with reference to complaints in question,
 H. Hensey's letter.

On the 4th Nov last, my wife, who was ill, went from here to Galway, her native town, where she was under the medical care of Dr Colahan and Sandys. I went to see her on the 7th of last month and remained with her until Friday 8th inst. when she was admitted into the Union Hospital to Dr Colahan's ward about 4 o'clock. The day previous I paid the Relieving Officer £1-1-0 for a month's hospital charges, and was informed by him that if she did not spend the month there ~~and~~ the balance would be returned to me as he said the charge was 9^d per day. I also provided my wife with a bottle of best port and a flask containing half a pint of best brandy in case of need. About 7 o'clock, on the following Wednesday, 4 1/2 days after her entry, she died. I went to Galway as soon as possible, provided a coffin, paid for shrouding, cost of a telegram, &c, and when the funeral was over on Friday 15 was informed by the Master of the Workhouse that the £1-1-0 was expended on her maintenance. Now being a month with her up to 8th inst. I have a perfect knowledge of what nourishment she was able to use (which unfortunately was very little) and in connection with this I give you an extract from a letter she wrote to me on Tuesday 12th inst. the day before she died.

"There is no staff of nurses here, Saturday night and Sunday I was left without a friend, I have to scramble out myself in the night and sometimes in the day to the night chair,

"There is one nurse here for night duty and she has nine wards to look after; so you must think if she gave me my turn I could not expect a second. The man took my purse on charge with nine or ten shillings in it and today she told me she had no more cash, I then using no food as I got knocked up after coming in; it was nine o'clock that evening before I came through and when I asked for some warm milk was told the man had gone to her room, so I had to do the best I could. Need I say I miss you, Dr Colahan is very attentive."

Now Sir, I do not object to pay any reasonable charge connected with my late dear wife, but I certainly have a great objection to being fleeced because I was a stranger in Galway. She had a cash box containing a few pounds which fortunately the hospital people did not discover, else probably it would have been collared as well as the rest. The poor woman was suffering from Dropsy and needed a good deal of care which I fear she did not receive; and the only matter that induced me to allow her to go in was, that she was anxious to get under the constant medical care of Dr Colahan.
