Seed Potatoes Supply.

Meeting Specially summoned as per Form C.

21<sup>st</sup> Dec: 04. } From the L. G. Board transmitting a Memorandum  
30<sup>th</sup> Dec: } -um which has been prepared for the Guardians' information by the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction with reference to the selection, purchase, storage, and distribution of seed potatoes; and stating that the Board trust that the Guardians will find this document useful in determining the tenders to be accepted for the supply of seed to the Union.

Any information the Guardians may require as to the purchase, storage, and inspection of seed may be obtained by communicating with the Chief Seed Inspector of the Board.

*The Memorandum was read and the contents were noted.*

21<sup>st</sup> Dec: 04. } From same, stating that in the event of the  
30<sup>th</sup> Dec: } Guardians deciding to apply for a loan for the purchase of seed potatoes, it will be necessary for them, when inviting tenders for the supply of seed, to specify the date for the delivery thereof, bearing in mind that the date of delivery should be so fixed that as brief an interval as possible may elapse between the receipt of the seed and its distribution, and that the potatoes may be carefully inspected before despatch by one of the Board's Seed Inspectors. In 1898 the dates of delivery of seed in the various Unions were so arranged as to prevent the despatch of large quantities

within a period so short as to make it impossible for the Seed Inspectors to examine carefully each consignment, and the great majority of the Boards of Guardians, at the Board's suggestion, adopted such dates for delivery as secured that in all cases the seed was carefully inspected. It is of the utmost importance that the Board should be in a position as early as possible to make out a table of dates for delivery so that there may be no congestion of traffic or delay in inspection and despatch of seed. The Board are of opinion that in the Galway Union the tenders should specify delivery between 15<sup>th</sup> Feb., and 1<sup>st</sup> March next. If the Guardians agree to this suggestion the Board should be informed immediately after the decision of the Guardians to apply for a loan is arrived at, and the Board will then make all necessary arrangements to ensure the inspection of the potatoes as soon as practicable after the contracts have been entered into.

Resolved unanimously - that application be made for a loan for the purchase of seed potatoes.

That we consider the dates for delivery of seed mentioned by the L. G. Board, namely, between 15<sup>th</sup> Feb., and 1<sup>st</sup> March next, too late, and that instead the delivery should be between the 1<sup>st</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> Feb., to ensure a timely distribution of the seeds.

The Clerk submitted the lists furnished to

him of persons in each Electoral Division of the Union who desire to purchase seed potatoes, with a summary thereof, the total quantity being 526 tons, and 12 cwt.

Several Guardians stated that they had not completed the lists and consequently a larger quantity will be required.

Resolved - that we advertise in the "General Advertiser," "Belfast Newsletter," and "North British Agriculturist," Edinburgh, for tenders for the supply of 550 tons of Champion, and 5 tons of Beauty of Bute seed potatoes. Delivery at Galway, either at the Docks or Railway Station, between the 1<sup>st</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> prox. Tenders to be considered at meeting on the 18<sup>th</sup> inst.

It was proposed by Mr. Basserly, and seconded by Mr. M. Grealish, that two persons, either Guardians or Ratepayers, be deputed to examine the seed potatoes before shipment to Galway.

This motion was opposed by the majority of the Guardians in attendance and was not adopted though no division was taken on it.

It was proposed by Mr. M. Redington, seconded by Mr. P. Murray, and

Resolved - that we call upon the Agricultural and Technical Board for Ireland to devise some means whereby small landholders and labourers with gardens or con-acre, may be supplied with small quantities of new varieties of seed potatoes free of cost in order to introduce disease resisting seed into

this country, that we also call upon them to distribute amongst the same class of people small packages of various seeds suitable for Kitchen gardens. We believe that the Agricultural Department has ample funds available, and we consider this to be of much more importance to the poor than the breeding of poultry, bees, &c. Copies to be sent to the Chief Sec. Chairman of the Irish Parliamentary Party, County M.P.s, and the Agricultural Department.

It was proposed by Mr. J. Wallace, seconded by Mr. E. Burke, and Resolved that believing that the expenses connected with the delivery of seed potatoes in the remote districts of the Union along the seaboard, would be too heavy for the poor and chronically destitute ratepayers, we
