It was proposed by *Mr. M. Cooke*, and seconded by *Mr. J. F. Egan*, — That the application be granted.

It was proposed as an amendment by *Mr. E. J. Burke*, and seconded by *Mr. P. Curran* — That it be not granted.

On a division 10 Guardians voted for, and 11 against the amendment.

The original motion was declared carried.

It was proposed by *Mr. P. Curran*, and seconded by *Mr. P. Hawless* — That *D. Kinsella* be required to remunerate his substitute for his services.

It was proposed as an amendment by *Mr. M. Cooke*, and seconded by *Mr. J. F. Egan*, That *D. Kinsella* be not required to remunerate his substitute for his services.

On a division 8 Guardians voted for, and 13 against the amendment.

The original motion was declared carried.

31st Aug. '05, From *D. Walsh*, Medical Officer of the *Drammore* Dispensary District, pointing out the dampness of the Dispensary Residence, and the need for two new grates and a cooking range being supplied.

31st Aug. '05, From *Mr. Kins*, Engineer, on the same subject, recommending the supply of two new grates, a cooking range, and locks and other repairs.

and estimating the cost of all at £ 18-10-0.

Order. *D. Walsh* to be asked to make a selection of the grates and range required and submit the estimate to the Guardians.

31st Aug. '05, From *D. Sweeney*, Medical Officer of the *Spiddal* Dispensary District, requesting the Guardians to provide him with a residence, either by building or purchasing it. Stating that since he came to the district, nearly a year ago, he has had to rent a furnished house at great discomfort to himself and family.

Marked "read," on the motion of *Mr. P. Curran*, seconded by *Mr. P. Hawless*.

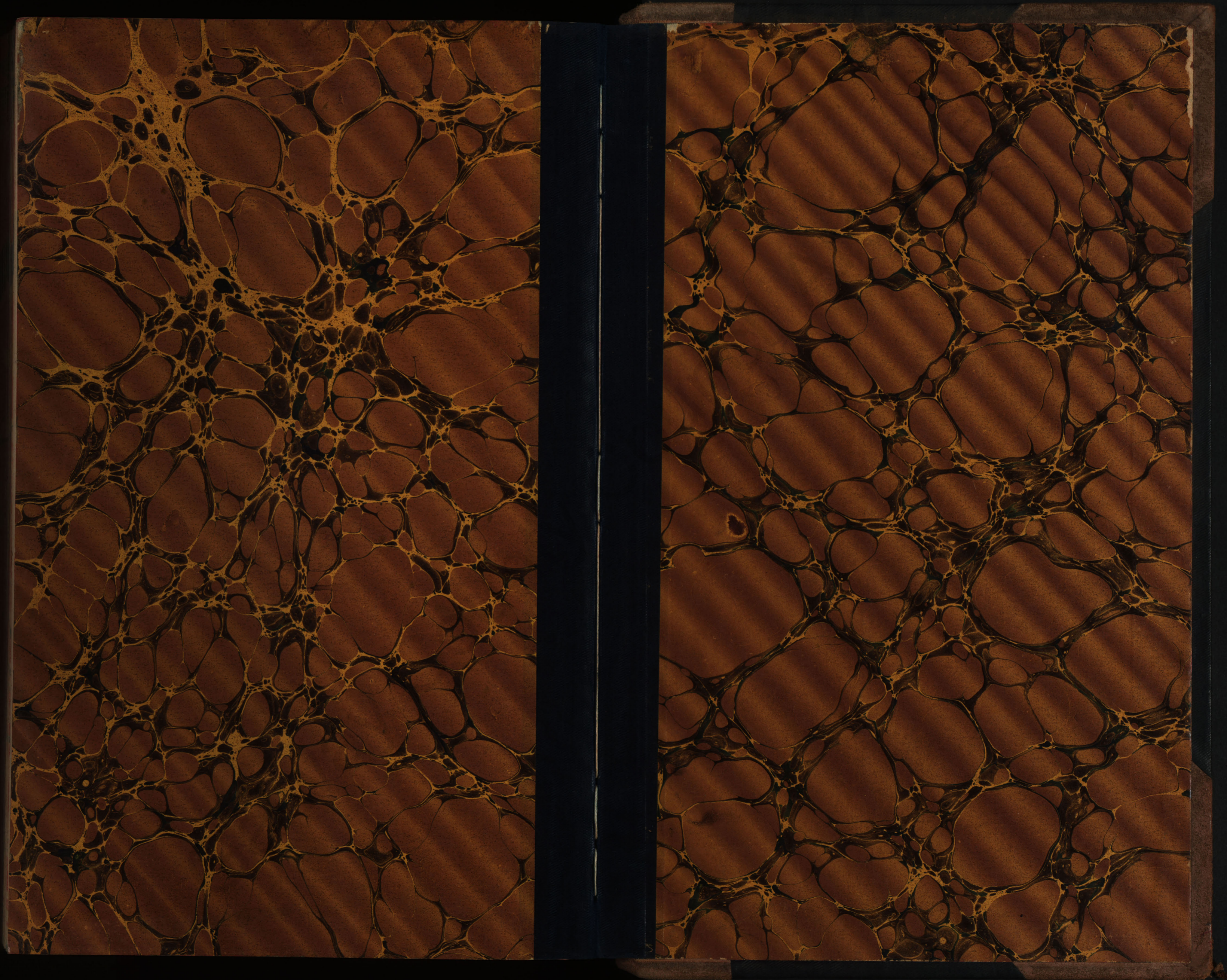
