Nurse Gore entered on her duties in the Fever Hospital on the 6<sup>th</sup> inst, Temporary Nurse Gore left there on the 18<sup>th</sup> inst,

Nurse Maria Bowles took up duty in the Workhouse this morning as substitute for Nurse Corless who has gone on vacation.

The Contractor for roof repairs has not attended when called upon during the past week to execute necessary repairs.

*Order. Another person to be employed at his expense.*

A schoolboy absconded from the Workhouse by scaling the boundary wall on the 14<sup>th</sup> inst, but was brought back, since then two other boys attempted to abscond.

*Order. A watch to be kept on the schoolboys.*

The Contractor for bread failed to send a supply on the morning of the 17<sup>th</sup> inst. I purchased elsewhere and charged him with the extra price.

*Order. The contractor to be again cautioned.*

Michael Farde, sentenced on the 14<sup>th</sup> inst, to a fortnight's imprisonment for refusing to work in the Workhouse, was again admitted on the 17<sup>th</sup> inst. He was under the influence of drink when admitted, and used threats towards me, he has refused to work.

*Order. To be again prosecuted.*

Illness of the Medical Officer of Galway No. 3 Dispensary District (Arann Islands).

14 July '05. Telegram from Relieving Officer: "Doctor still unfit for duty. Wired Doctor Lettermore attend to get patients, any available Galway come tomorrow."

17<sup>th</sup> " " Further: "send nurse for typhoid case. Nurse Hedderman leaving tomorrow. Had Doctor from Lettermore again yesterday. Dr. Kinsella expects to do duty tomorrow."

17<sup>th</sup> " " Dr. Kinsella reports himself bad again, try and get Doctor from Dublin."

19<sup>th</sup> " " Dr. Kinsella nothing better, supposed case scarlatina also here; trusting Doctor will come tomorrow."

The Clerk informed the Guardians that he had sent a nurse to Arann as requested by the Relieving Officer, that he was unable to procure the services of a Medical Practitioner for the District until today. Dr. James Byrne has promised to go to Arann by steamer tomorrow morning.

17 July '05. From Dr. Tho. McDonogh of Lettermore, (Oughterard Union), stating that he was called upon by the Relieving Officer of Arann Islands to visit some patients on the Islands. Visited two patients one day, and one of them again on second day. Mary Scruon is suffering from typhoid fever. Took all precautions, ordered a nurse, disinfected, and destroyed some clothing. As the distance is too far, it would be well to get a *locum tenens* to reside on the Island until the Medical Officer resumes duty as energetic steps must be taken to prevent the disease being disseminated. Fees made up as follows:—

3 visits, £6-6-0, carhire 10/-, boathire £2. Total £8-16-0.

*Order.* Payment as follows:— 2 visits to the Island £4-4-0, carhire 10/-, boathire £2. Total £6-14-0.

In pursuance of notice given, Mr. P. Murray proposed that a trained Midwife be appointed for the Curroughmore Dispensary District.

The motion was seconded by Mr. M. Ryan.

The motion was opposed by Mr. Hornell and Mr. Ryan, and a division challenged. A poll was taken with the result that 12 Guardians voted for, and 14 against the motion. It was declared lost.

Mr. W. Coe's notice of motion, that the renting of a room in the house of Thomas Jordan of Cossam be discontinued as the Medical

Officer has not made use of it, and it is not required, After some discussion this motion was withdrawn, Order. The Receiving Officer of the District to be called upon to attend at Thomas Jordan's house at Crossarm, at 2 pm, on the first and second Thursday in September next, and to report whether the Medical Officer attended on those days. The Medical Officer's attention to be directed to the Notice Form N, which mentions the days the Guardians require him to attend at Thomas Jordan's house as a Vaccination District.
