 Mr Patrick Curran having been elected Rural District councillor for the Carna Electoral Division, also as Guardian for the West Urban District, elected to act as District Councillor and Guardian for the Carna Electoral Division, in consequence, it was unanimously declared that a vacancy in the office of Guardian for the West Urban ^{District} exists,
 The co-opting of Mr W. Lawless to fill the vacancy was proposed by Mr P. Curran, seconded by Mr P. Cannon and carried.

The election of Mr. Patrick Curran as Chairman of the Board of Guardians for the ensuing year was proposed by Mr. M. McNeill and seconded by Mr. M. Coen.

The election of Mr. Martin Cooke was proposed by Mr. J. Bailey and seconded by Mr. M. Grealish. On a division Mr. Curran received 38 votes, and Mr. Cooke 19 votes.

Mr. Curran was declared duly elected.

The election of Mr. Martin Birmingham as Vice Chairman was proposed by Mr. M. Redington and seconded by Mr. M. McDonogh.

The election of Mr. Michael Murphy was proposed by Mr. M. McNeill and seconded by Mr. P. Murray.

The Reports of the Master and other Officers were read, and orders made thereon as follows:—

Contractor Reardon's milk was under standard twice since last meeting of the Board, registering 5 degrees of cream on each occasion. He forfeited the quantity 4 gallons. This is the second report against him.

The Inspector under the Food and Drugs Act was present on the 9th inst. when bread was delivered by the contractor. Out of 33 loaves 13 were under weight; in all, 13 1/4 lbs. On the 10th inst. the Inspector took samples of the milk delivered by the contractor. The Bread contractor has been most unsatisfactory since last Board Day. I had to return bread on several occasions for being under weight. He makes several deliveries daily of the quantity required causing the meals to be sometimes late. I returned brown bread several times being inferior in quality.

The driver of the ambulance let the horse fall causing an injury to his knee. I got a Veterinary Surgeon to treat him.

The Schoolmaster absented himself from the Workhouse on the following dates:— May 31st out at 1-30 pm, in at 10 pm; June 1st out at 4 pm, not returned when locking up at 10 pm; On the Carter's Book his time when returning to the Workhouse is stated to be unknown. June 10th out at 2-30 pm, in at 9 pm; June 11th out at 12-30 pm, in at 9 pm. I placed a man in charge of the boys.
