26 Sept. '05, From the Medical Officer of the Galway No. 3 Dispensary District, stating that on the 25th inst. he found it necessary to have the assistance of another Medical Practitioner in consultation on a Dispensary patient who is suffering from a very severe compound fracture of the ankle joint, and as D. Hopkins of Castlebar happened to be in the district, he availed himself of his assistance. They decided that the best thing to be done in the case was to have the patient carefully removed to Galway Hospital, as there is no suitable place for such cases in the district. The Relieving Officer was instructed to remove the patient.
