The Morkhouse Schoolenaster furnished an esoplanation as to the deficiencies in the stock of clothing in his charge on the occasion of the handing over of stock to the temporary substitute, as follows:

Shortly before I took all I took an inventory of the barions articles and found that nothing was missing with the exception of I coat, 2 bosts, and I pair of suspenders while there happened to be an escess of 2 pairs of boots, Several weeks were allowed to lapse before the stock was conntect by the Master and handed over to ony substitute, Leveral of the Schoolboys told me that in the meantime, after I had left for the Tever Hospital, they saw the late Worthouse Tailor tear up endis-- Cruenately a grantity of boys as wellas mens' clothing, presumably for the purpose of mending the others, It is well known that on the case of sekvol - boys it is almost suposseble to have their stock of clothing complete in every detail; a boy night happen to break or lose a suspender, or his cap night accidentally fall suto the fire, or be blown away by the wend, I becomes less excusable however When coats, vests, and trowsers are mutilated in the manner described, the defeciency at the end fahalf year under beek conditions nightbe considerable. It is remarkable that whereas the Master found a substantial defect in the boys clottering, the general Stocklaker found everything satisfactory as he had on every previous occasion, and it is significant that the only occasion that ever called forth an explanation from me in regards to the stock was when shappened to be away on sick leave, I wish to draw attention to the wheet of any facility for Reefsering Stock in this department of the house, At present there is no store either for good Clothing not in wear, or for bad clothing mifit for wear! Come years ago a small start for the boys cast of

clothing was erected in one of the top garrets of the Holhouse. Recently, however, owing to congestion in the house population this garret has been fitted up as a sleeping apartment for a Section of the enmates, and is now Known as 1.8 Infirm Hard, so that I can have no further access to this room and must only keep the old and worn out clothing in the School until they become a veritable eye sore in the place, It would be well the Master should see his way to take outo his stare the boys clothing not in wear and give them out when required as the Matron dees in the case of socks and shirts.
