defencing to the certifien the Meintes of the 29th self. from which it appears that the will supplied to the Horkhouse by certain contractors turned sour and that some of it registered six degrees of cream. The Board find that there are summerous sutries of a similar character on previous flientes, and as milk is one of the most suportant articles on the diet of Morthouse sumates, particularly of the children and sick classes, they desire to state thatthe matter seems to call for the sereous attention of the Guardians. Their duty is to quard the interests of the rate payers and of the mustes of the Worthouse, and they should avoid the appearance of giving more consederation to the interests of the contractors than to those they are specially appointed to look after, They shired therefore accept no excuse from a contractor for supplying will which does not - con. ply with the legal requirements, It seems clear from the frequency of the complaints that the means at-present adopted by the Guardians for checking the abuse are madegrate, In two cases, the Board observe that contractors have already been prosecuted and fined for supplying wilk under the legal stand--and, and they further observe that contractors whose will registers less than a fixed rumber of degrees of cream forfeit a certain grantity, but they are not aware whether such growthy represents the total amount of onferior will supplied by the contradors, or only a partien of it. If the total grantity is forfeited, and if, in addition, better will is purchased at

the expense of the defaulting contractors, the fre-- greney with which inferior milk is supplied might be considerably lessened, The Board presence that there is a clouse in the contractors bourds enabling the Guardians to do this, and, if so, such clause or ght to be strictly enforced, of however, a clause of the nature referred to is not on the bonds of the execting contractors, itshould be meested in all future centracts that may be entered outo. thould the means suggested be formed insufficiont to prevent contractors from continuing milk of suferior quality, the only course opento the Guard-- caus would be to canbet the contracts, The Board trust the Guardians will give the Reebject their careful consideration, and take the most strengent measures possible with a view to compelling contractors to deliver the best will only for use in the Northouse. the quantity forfeited represents the total amountof enferior wiell supplied by the contractor on each delivery. There is such a clause in the contractors bonds and the Guardians endeavour to enforce it, but it is not always possible to procure a supply of will from persons other than contractors, wen though a high price be offered. Then the usual subelitutes have to be given the extra cast-being Charged against the defaulting contractors,
