“RESOLVED—

“That the attention of His Majesty's Government be drawn to the injustice inflicted on Boards of Guardians and Clerks of Unions by the provisions of the Section 83, sub-section 7, of the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898, by which the duties formerly performed by the latter officers, and still by existing officers, under the Registration and Juries' Acts are now transferred to Secretaries of County Councils, the results of which are:—

“1st. The work is less efficiently performed, owing to the want of local knowledge of County Secretaries, which is essential to the accurate preparation of the Lists, and the lack of information regarding disqualifications which is in the procurement of Clerks of Unions;

“2nd. A clear loss to the ratepayers inasmuch as in the case of a new appointment to the office of Clerk of Union the Guardians have to make up by an increased salary for the loss of remuneration under the Registration and Juries' Acts;

“3rd. A further loss to the ratepayers in the case of a Union extending into two or more Counties, inasmuch as the combined fees payable to the County Secretaries of such Counties as contain part of the Union exceed the fees which would be payable to the Clerk of the Union for such work;

“Under these circumstances we earnestly call upon the Government to so amend the law as to transfer the preparation of the Lists from Secretaries of County Councils to Clerks of Unions, as we are confident that by so doing more accurate Lists will be ensured.”

On the motion of Mr. Crowley, seconded by Sir J. O'Donohoe, this resolution was adopted.

I admitted on 2nd inst. a tramp named Edward Mulroy, who is a cripple and mendicant. He was at the Races where he lost his donkey. Mulroy was brought to the Workhouse by the Police, and, when admitted he had in his possession 9th, which I shall hold. I had a tramp named Edward Murren who was admitted on 2nd inst before a Magistrate, charged with visiting this Workhouse on eight different occasions during past five months. He was remanded to Petty Sessions on Monday last, when the case was adjourned for a week. I wrote to Martin Donnellan on 21st ult. requesting payment of £1-16-5, being for his wife & child's maintenance in Workhouse, with costs of Court. The letter was returned by the Postal Authorities, marked "left - no address." His wife was discharged from Hospital on 30th ult.

An inmate named Martin Cooke, was working in the tailor's Shop on 30th ult., when he suddenly left his work and jumped from a second storey window into the yard, fracturing his arm. He was admitted to Hosp^l and is still a patient.

Wm^m Connell was brought to the Workhouse by the Police on 27th ult., having fallen into the river. He was admitted to Hospital and is now recovered from the effects.

The following Orders of the Local Government Board for Ireland were laid before the Guardians, and directions given thereon as follows—

On the requisition of the Relieving Officer of the Drammore Dist., I sent the Ambulance to Ballinacorney on the 5th inst. to remove to Hospital a tramp named Thomas Flynn, who was found lying out. He arrived at the Workhouse at 11-50 p.m. and died twenty minutes after admission. I had sent for the Medical Officer, but the patient was dead before he arrived. The Coroner was notified, but he did not deem it necessary to hold an inquest. I had samples of the milk delivered on 6th inst., sent for analysis.
