Having had to send the Ambulance to Salt Hill on 30<sup>th</sup> ult. and Wood Quay on 1<sup>st</sup> inst. for a tramp named Lizzie Devine, and she being under the influence of drink on both occasions, I took her before a Magistrate and got her 14 days imprisonment with hard labour.

Nurse Molloy resumed duty in the Workhouse Hospital after 4 weeks' vacation on 8<sup>th</sup> inst. and her substitute, Nurse Torney, left on same day.

By direction of Dr. Bolahan, I allowed the Fever Hospital Cook 2 days leave of absence, the Nurses and Wardsmaid undertaking to do her duty.

Mary Kenny was admitted to the Lying-in Hospital on 2<sup>nd</sup> inst. and Mary Hynes on the 10<sup>th</sup>. Each gave birth to an illegitimate child on date of admission.

Dr. McDonagh having reported that milk contractor Tho<sup>s</sup> Dr. Gath had put his premises in a sanitary condition, I allowed him to resume the supply of milk to the Workhouse on 10<sup>th</sup> inst.

- 1 The financial condition of the Union is only fairly satisfactory, there being a slight debt at the close of the quarter ended the 30<sup>th</sup> June last.
- 2 Samples of milk should be sent at least once a month for analysis.
- 3 Separate wards should be provided for the treatment of consumptive patients.
- 4 A few of the window sashes should be replaced.

5 The Visiting Committee seldom meets, unless specially summoned. The terms of Article 59 of the Workhouse Rules should be complied with.

*Guardians Observations.*

- 1 After discharging their liabilities for the month of July, the Guardians have a balance of £613-1-11 to their credit, and they feel quite confident that unless something unforeseen occurs, their finances will be in a fairly sound condition at close of current financial year.
- 2 The Master informed the Guardians that samples of milk are sent for analysis about every month.
- 3 The Guardians at present are not prepared to incur any expenditure in providing wards for Consumptive Patients.
- 4 For some years past, the Guardians have been gradually replacing the old metal sash windows, with new wooden sash ones.
- 5 No order made.

Adverting to previous Correspondence and to the Minutes of the 10<sup>th</sup> ultimo, and stating that, under the circumstances set forth in the Minutes, they have sanctioned the payment of a sum of £2:2:0 to Dr. J. M. A. Costello as remuneration for his temporary services as Medical Officer and Medical Officer of Health of the Moykullen Dispensary District of the Union

12<sup>th</sup> August, From Dr. Gamon, Medical Officer of the Oranmore Disp. District, applying for some requisites for the Dispensary, also pointing out that there some repairs necessary to be carried out both in the Dispensary and Dispensary Residence. Referred to a Committee consisting of Messrs. W. Keane, W. Walsh, J. Curmuffe, Dr. Keig, and Dr. Cannon. The said Committee to meet Dr. Gamon at the Dispensary on Sunday next at 12 o'clock.

The Acting Clerk submitted Requisitions for Medicines received from the Spiddal and Turloughmore Dispensary Districts. He pointed out to the Guardians, that although the population of the two Districts and the number of Tickets attended to are comparatively the same, yet the gross cost of the Medicines Requisitioned for Turloughmore only amounted to £8-4-10, whilst Spiddal amounted to £21-0-11. The latest Requisition for Medicines received from the Galway 142 Dispensary District only amounted to £11-5-9. and we hereby direct the Acting Clerk to furnish Dr. Kirwan's Requisition to the L. G. Board, with a request that they will furnish the Guardians with an expression of opinion, as to whether they consider it exorbitant or not.
