Glynn*, Medical Officer of the *Surloughmore Dispensary District*, relative to fees due to him for performing the operation of Vaccination in the district, and requesting that the Clerk will furnish his observations in regard to the matter.

Copy of Communication referred to.

I beg to inform you that I have not been paid for Vaccination returns sent in last June. Also that there is a marginal note in the Vaccination that I will not be paid for eight Vaccinations performed in the month of February, although I applied for payment for same on two occasions, viz. - March and June last.

Clerk's Observations.

Since January last *D. Glynn* furnished two accounts for Vaccination fees. *No 1* was discharged by a Paying Order issued to him on the 10th April last, *No 2* account is dated 24th June last. This account has not, up to the present, been paid for the reason that the entries in the Vaccination Register were not completed when the Register was submitted for examination in July, 34 entries were not signed ^{by the Medical Officer}, and 2, not dated. When the Register was examined on the 14th inst, all the blanks were filled in and the account was passed for payment at Finance Meeting on the 11th inst. 8 cases of Vaccination performed in February and March last, being statute barred, were struck out.

4th Sept: 07. From *Dr M. McDonough*, Medical Officer of *Galway No 2 Dispensary District*, reporting that he had two Vaccination defaulters summoned to the Petty Sessions Court on the 2nd inst. The one Magistrate in attendance declined to hear the cases because the Guardians were not represented by a Solicitor and adjourned the cases for a week.
