The Inspector made a thorough examination of the steam boiler in the Workhouse yesterday, the hand cart requires a new wheel and some repairs.

*Ordered.*

The Schoolmaster, Tailor, and Shoemaker visited the Exhibition on the 17<sup>th</sup> inst. as allowed by the Board on the 11<sup>th</sup> inst. I had two men in charge of the boys.

Though improved, the Medical Officer is still dissatisfied with the bread supplied to the Workhouse. I sent for the Slater yesterday morning to remove some <sup>grass</sup> off the roof of the Dispensary, though he said he remove it the grass is still on. Martin Keedy, Wardsman resumed duty this morning after vacation.

*Order.* If the slating contractor does not remove the grass within a few days as directed, a person to be employed to do so at his expense.

*Workhouse Medical Officer.*

The bread is improved but there is room for further improvement.

The Porter of the Dispensary complained to me that his wife again abused him on the 14<sup>th</sup> inst. It is a serious matter to have quarrelling <sup>going</sup> on in the Porter's apartments which are underneath

the lying-in Wards in which there is a patient seriously ill, should this quarrelling go on, I cannot hold myself responsible for the life of that patient. The Dispensary, owing to this quarrelling is badly kept.

*Order.* The Solicitor to be instructed to proceed against the wife and son of the Dispensary Porter for breaking windows in the Dispensary, at Petty Sessions on Monday next.
