Workhouse Schoolmaster.

The conduct of four of the senior schoolboys is remarkably bad. During the short time I was at luncheon yesterday they kicked my hat about the school and broke it. Pat Berkers is the leader in showing bad example, and he has given me a deal of impertinence. The work of the school cannot possibly go on with success unless discipline is strictly enforced.

*The Guardians in attendance visited the school and administered a warning to the boys that a repetition of bad conduct will bring on them severe punishment.*

accordingly be asked to tender her resignation,  
*Mary Daly is a well conducted woman, hence the

4<sup>th</sup> June '07. From Harriet Cooke, Kildermunster, claiming  
 the medals of Army Pensioner John Cooke, who  
 died in Salway Workhouse, stating that she is his  
 widow.

 he was never married. That she must furnish  
 some proof of her marriage with him.*

5<sup>th</sup> June '07. From the Irish Industrial Development Association,
