The alterations made in the female children's dormitory to provide accommodation for probationer nurses should they be admitted to the house, have not yet been removed and the children are consequently placed in the most disadvantageous circumstances possible. Request the Master to have the temporary boardings removed and the dormitory restored to its former condition.

The Guardians at meeting on the 5<sup>th</sup> inst. warned her that another report on the inferior quality of the milk supplied would lead to the cancellation of her contract.
