At the same time we wish to draw attention to the
gross injustice of the clause proposing to exclude
from all benefit persons who have been in receipt
of relief under the Poor Laws.

In this Union - and we venture to say the same
remark will apply to every Union in Ireland - are
cases of men and women who led most exemplary
lives, and, through no fault of their own, but through
feeble health at the approach of old age, and in
some instances through the death of their bread
winners, have been compelled to accept out-door
relief or obtain shelter in the Workhouse. It is
manifestly unjust to debar such persons from
deriving benefit under the Act when passed, as
we feel assured it will.

That a copy of this resolution be sent to the Prime
Minister, the Chief Secretary for Ireland, the Chair-
man of the Irish Parliamentary Party, the Members
for the County and Borough of Galway, and
each Board of Guardians in Ireland.

sanctioning the payment of a sum of £1-1-0 to Dr. Cannon as remuneration for his services as temporary Medical Officer, &c. of the Kurlongmore Dispensary District.

26th May '08.

From Messrs. Clarke & Co. Medicines, &c. contractors, stating that the drug *belladonna* when it left their warehouse was up to the L.S. Board standard in alkaloids as it was tested by their Chemist before being despatched, that they are unable to account for the deficiency in alkaloids unless the sample was sent forward by the Medical Officer in a wet bottle. A fresh supply of the drug in lieu of the quantity returned was duly forwarded.

The fresh supply has been received and a sample of it forwarded to the Analyst.

Dr. M. McDonogh submitted a reply he received from the L.S. Board to an inquiry on the subject, "that item No. 23 (*MacFarlane's Aether*) on the Board's Prescribed List of Medicines is specified to be supplied in 1 lb. original stoppered bottles and the cost of the bottle is included in the prescribed price. Contractors are not therefore entitled to make any charge for bottles containing the article in question."

The Clerk having communicated this opinion to Messrs. Clarke & Co. the contractors, received a reply from them as follows:— "We note the Local Government Board's remarks with regard to bottles supplied under *MacFarlane's Aether*, but we propose charging for all packages unless those which the cost of the bottle

is included in the price of the drug, and this is not stated on the L.S.B. list with regard to aether bottles. The Guardians beg the attention of the L.S. Board to this matter.

Sir A. Macbullagh, L.S. Medical Inspector, stated that yesterday he visited the Spiddal Dispensary and examined the *Neville's Forceps* there and found it in good working order except that there was some rust-betraying want of care on the part of the Medical Officer.

In the circumstances the Guardians decline to order a new forceps.
