If the business of the laundress were only the washing, drying, &c. of the clothes it would be easy to train a woman to do this, but the amount of coal and steam used have also to be considered, and a careful, trustworthy person is required to prevent waste. It would be impossible for me to spend any more time in the laundry than I have done up to the present without neglecting some of my numerous duties. If the laundry be left in charge of an inmate who may leave the Workhouse any moment, I cannot be responsible for the Officers' and inmates' clothing.

M. W. B. Reeves gave notice of motion to consider this application at meeting on the 11th prox.

The following Letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland and others were read by the Clerk, and directions given to answer them respectively, to the following effect (or Orders made on them respectively, as follows):—

Referring to queries respecting Ellen Connor, who has been employed temporarily as Wardsmaid in the Fever Hospital; pointing out that as it appears that this woman is 70 years of age she is rather old to discharge some of the duties which devolve on a wardsmaid, the Board request that they may be informed whether the Guardians could not have procured a more suitable person for the post. *The Guardians at the time could not procure a more suitable person. It is at all times a difficult matter to get a person to undertake temporary work in a Fever Hospital. Ellen Connor acted in a similar capacity on many occasions during the past 40 years. The Guardians request the Board's sanction to the payment to her of 1/- for her services for 18 days.*
