The ceiling in the passage between the Kitchen & Laundry in the Fever Hospital has fallen down. *Repairs deferred as there are 10 patients in the Hospital.* Mr. Lydon has finished his contract for stoves, &c. in the Workhouse, I got him to do some repairs to the drying closet in Hospital, & a grate in the Dispensary, the range in Hospital Ditary, & a range in the Fever Hospital, as they were urgent.

Approved.

The driver was taking the remains of James Lerman to Bohernmore Cemetery for interment on the 30th inst., was met by friends of the deceased to whom he handed over the remains for interment in Meuls. On his return he met the Chaplain on his way to the Cemetery & he turned him back. The friends instead of taking the remains to Meuls took them to Bohernmore Cemetery where they were interred by men from the Workhouse without the Chaplain being present.

Order. The driver to be cautioned.

The Clerk of Union called the Guardians' attention to the unsatisfactory supervision of the bathing of the infirm male inmates of the Workhouse immediately under the Board Room. The water is sometimes allowed to overflow which causes a most unpleasant odour when the ashes of the

fireplace gets wet. A great risk is run of the feeble old men being suffocated in the bath. He is of the belief that the water is never from beginning to termination of the bathing process fully cleared out, simply allowed to trickle in & out.

Order. The Master to see that a responsible person supervises the bathing of the old men & that fresh water is supplied to the bath for each inmate.

On the motion of Mr. Martin Moloney, seconded by Mr. N. Lydon, Mr. James Lee was added to the Workhouse Visiting Committee.

Courtenay, pointing out to the Guardians that he renewed the lease of the old Fever Hospital to them at a reasonable rent some years ago, & when the Guardians anticipated building a new Hospital they asked him to accept a surrender & this he consented to do. Having regard to the way in which he met the Guardians' wishes he considers that the Galway Granite, &c. Co. should have a preference in the supply of stones for the new building provided they can tender for same as low as others. This industry was started by himself & friends to benefit the Town of Galway & it has given considerable employment. A great deal of money has been spent so far without any return whatever. The industry should receive consideration & support locally.
