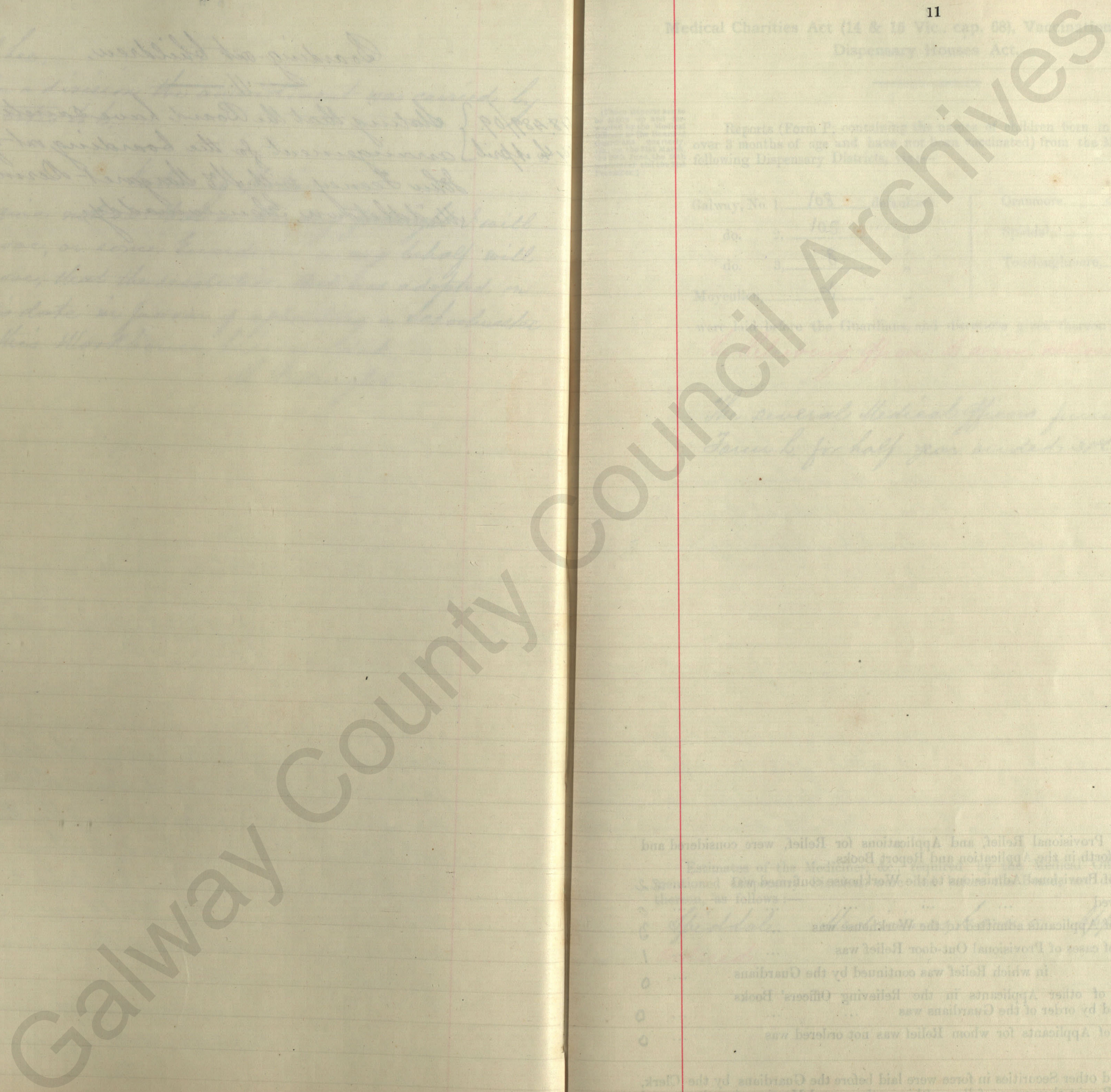

Referring to the recent reports of the Committee of Ladies upon the children boarded out in the Clonnamaddy district, the children in charge of Wm Dowd, John Morgan (Cousin?), & Luke King are described as being only "fairly" well clad, & the Board request that the foster parents in these cases may be informed that if a similar report is received from the lady visitor in future, the children will be transferred to other houses.

The school attendance of the children Jos. Sullivan, Martin Haire, Mathias & Michael Flaherty & Peter Murphy is irregular, & the foster parents should be cautioned on the subject.

In regard to the clothing, the foster parents are not to be blamed as the clothing of the children named is becoming worn out & new clothing is being provided for them.

The irregularity in the matter of school attendance has been explained by the Rev. W. Conway, Chairman of the Committee in his letter entered in the Minutes of the 14th inst. The Guardians feel satisfied that the Visiting Committee will see that the children are properly cared.
