Read Letter from L.G.B. No 113030/09, dated 27th Sept 1909

Moved by Mr. McNeill, seconded by Mr. W. Redington, & Resolved. That Dr. Sandys be offered a fee of £2-2-0 in this case with an allowance of £1-1-0 for car hire.

That the sanction of the L.G. Board to the payment of this fee be requested.

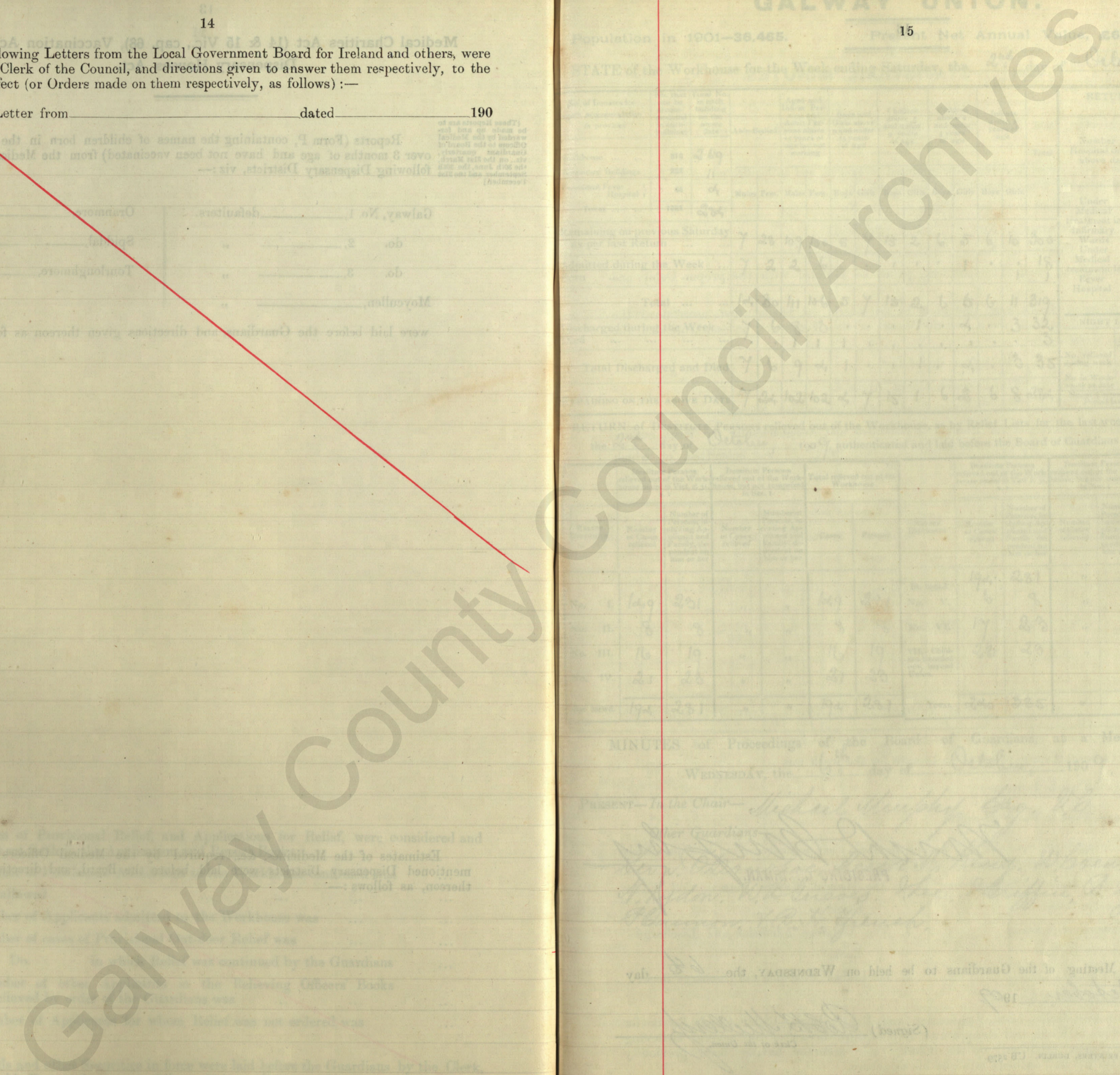
