Read Letter from *L.G. Board No. 12575/09* dated *19th October 1909*.

transmitting an extract from a letter which the Board have received from Dr. Glynn, relative to the arrangements proposed to be made for the discharge of his duties as Medical Officer of the Enloughmore Dispensary District during his absence on vacation. The Board desire to point out that Dr. Glynn had nominated Dr. V. Cuskelly as his substitute & by this nomination a resident temporary Medical Officer would have been secured for the sick poor, & at the same time the Medical Officer would perhaps have been enabled to make a suitable arrangement as regards his private practice. The Board consider that the Guardians ought unless they have special reasons for not doing so, to accept the Medical Practitioner nominated by the Medical Officer, as there are obvious reasons why a Medical Officer may be reluctant to entrust his duties & private practice to a gentleman other than one selected by himself.

From Dr. Beirne, accepting the Guardians' offer of four weeks locum tenens duty in the Enloughmore Dispensary District, promising to reside in the District & to take up duty on the 1st prox, Moved by Mr. N. Lydon, seconded by Mr. Griffie, & Resolved - That Dr. V. B. Beirne be appointed to act as substitute for Dr. Glynn for four weeks at a remuneration at the rate of £4.4.0 a week, to take up duty on the 1st prox.

reason for appointing him.

16th Oct 09. From Dr. M. O'Brien, Medical Officer of the Galway No. 3 Dispensary District, stating in reply to the Guardians' inquiry, that Nurse Hedderman made arrangements with him for the discharge of her duties during her absence on a fortnight's vacation.

17th Oct 09. From Nurse Hedderman, stating that she had arranged with the Medical Officer for the discharge of her duties during her absence. The Medical Officer recommended a change as she was suffering from nervous exhaustion occasioned by the anxiety & severe strain of her work. The Relieving Officer's report on not giving him notice is a bit of red tape.

The Guardians expressed themselves satisfied with the explanation.

In pursuance of notice given for this date, Sir A. O'Donohoe moved - "That the scale of fees for extra professional assistance to Dispensary Medical Officers be amended so as to take in an allowance of a shilling per mile (Irish) for car hire," the motion having been seconded by Mr. N.
