4th Nov. } Referring to the proposal of the Guardians at meeting on the 20th inst. to provide temporary wooden shelters for the isolation & treatment of tuberculosis patients, & stating that before the Guardians go to the expense of providing these shelters they should select suitable sites for them, having regard to sunlight, air space, & convenience for nursing & supervision. The Board request that the Guardians will obtain a report from their Medical Officer on the subject. On 29th Sept. last a committee was appointed to consider this matter, in conjunction with the Workhouse Medical Officer & the Guardians' Engineer. The committee held a meeting on the 5th ult. & selected a site for the proposed shelters & reported thereon to the Guardians at meeting on the 6th ult. when the report, which was

signed by Dr. McDonogh, one of the Medical Officers, Dr. Colahan, the other, being then on vacation, ^{in his absence} as the Board can see the Guardians did obtain a report from their Medical Officer before coming to the decision to provide the shelters.
