Read Letter from Dr James O'Brien, dated 30th May 1910,

stating that he read in local papers that a statement was made at last meeting of the Board of Guardians that he disappointed Dr M. O'Brien, Medical Officer of Galway No. 3 Dispensary District, at the last moment. He wishes to correct this statement as he fears somebody has been misinformed. He was sanctioned as locum for 7 weeks ago, & waited to hear from Dr M. O'Brien as to the time he was going away to enjoy a month's rest. At the last moment he received a wire from Dr M. O'Brien asking him to come on immediately to do duty, beginning 19th May as he was called away on urgent business. Replied that he could not do so until the 26th May. Dr M. O'Brien wired that he could not wait & left on 21st May.

He (Dr M. O'Brien) was the disappointed person & not Dr M. O'Brien, as he might easily have procured a locum elsewhere.

Moved by Mr M. McNeill, seconded by Mr J. Griffin, & unanimously Resolved - That we respectfully request that the Local Government Board will decline to sanction an arrangement whereby a Medical Officer who has been granted vacation by the Board of Guardians of his Union, will undertake locum tenens duty in another Union.

The L.G. Board in Circular letters to Boards of Guardians have pointed out the necessity of allowing Medical Officers at least 4 weeks rest every year. Leaving one's own district to take up duty in another district is, in the opinion of this Board, an extraordinary way to take rest.

The L.G. Board through the Inquiries must be aware of such arrangements being made.
Copies of this resolution to be sent to the other Boards of Guardians in this County.

30th May '10. From Dr J. J. McDonagh, Medical Officer of Galway No. 1 Disp. Dist. stating that Dr J. Walsh cannot do duty for him during vacation, & asking the Guardians to appoint Dr J. J. Waters instead.

1st June '10. From Dr M. McDonagh, Medical Officer of Galway No. 2 Disp. Dist. stating that he received a red ticket to visit Pat. Barrett's daughter-in-law at Claddagh. On his way there he met Barrett who told him he did not want the patient removed to Hospital. He called once or twice to see the patient & advised her removal to Hospital but they refused to do so. Another medical practitioner was sent for & I am informed he advised the removal of the patient to the County Hospital & this was done.

He (Dr McDonagh) thought it was the rule that all patients sent to the County Hospital should be sent through the Workhouse Hospital except in cases of accidents or very urgent cases.
