In reply to your's of 9th inst. re. stock in excess or deficient, I beg to submit the following :-

Sledges. I have only I sledge on my return and this is the only one which was produced to me. Total 1. The Master said he thought he had more, but he did not produce them.

Scales. Male yard 1, Laundry & dietary 2, Fever Hospital 1, Bread store 1, Board room 3, Milk store 2, Pharmacy & drug store 2, In the Fever Hospital 1 scale sencelled which I added in error. The total amount of scales is 12 good.

Boilers. In Boiler House 1 steam boiler, Fever Hospital 1 Boiler (not a steam boiler) which leaves the total at 2.

Spades. Male yard 4, Fever Hospital 1, total 5. The difference appears to be 3 which were cancelled and which the Master must have added in error.

Tea Strainers. Of these there were none produced to me.

Trowels. In men's yard 1, there was no other mentioned or shown to me.

Weight sets. The correct number is 6. I entered one extra in error while copying.

Remarks.

In the above list I have given you the principal items in excess or deficient, all as returned by me. At this stocktaking, the Master had his book and took stock in it, while I was at the same timetaking it in mine, and the items were checked in each department as we proceeded and compared correctly.

Now I cannot see why the difference arises.

On Friday last in accordance with your notice I went to the Workhouse to take a list of the items questioned, and when about finished, I said to the Master "Mr. Athy how is it that there appears to be such a difference in your return and mine, did I not check each department with you, and you agreed that the stock was correct "His answer was "so it was correct, but it does not agree with the Summer Stock.".

I understand that you have advertised for a stocktaker for the 23rd instant, owing to the allegation that my stock was incorrect, but if your Board will see fit to appoint some responsible person to go round the House with me to check the articles in question, I hope to show that with a few trivial exceptions my stock is correct, and this could be done before your new appointment.

It will be within the recollection of the Guardians that the Master admitted to them that the last stocktaking was correct, and, he evidently believed that it was, and if so, and he having checked carefully everything with me, how can he alter it. For if the stock both of us checked is correct it cannot be altered.

It must also be understood that the Master was before the Auditor at the last audit, and that I was not called upon (although present in the house) therefore I do not know what took place, but from the recommendation made by the auditor in his report, I presume the case was stated all on one side as I had no chance of rebutting the statements (if any) then made.

Appointment. It must also be remembered when I was appointed to take this last stock, the Local Government Board stated they would raise no objection, provided the Guardians were satisfied, and the Guardians were satisfied because I was appointed. I cannot see why any Auditor under these circumstances could turn round and recommend I should not be remunserated for labor I had performed, the said Auditor having raised no objection before the work was commenced and practic-

practically finished. And what is better still not having at that time or even yet seen or audited the return which he recommended I should not be paid for, and, for which he advises a new appointment.

Hoping that your Board having appointed me will see fit to consider this as a satisfactory explanation and the only one which can be given in dealing with such a complicated question.
